

6 Jesuits to Be Ordained May 27

Six Jesuits will be ordained to the priesthood by Bishop Joseph L. Hogan, at St. John the Evangelist Church in Greece at 2:30 p.m., Saturday May 27. Among their number will be three alumni of McQuaid Jesuit High School in Rochester and a former faculty member at McQuaid.

Father Peter J. Murray, a native of Albany, taught English at the high school from 1966 to 1969. A graduate of the Vincentian Institute in Albany, Father Murray entered the Society of Jesus at Bellarmine College, Plattsburgh, in 1959. In 1965 he graduated from Fordham University with a B.A. in English and went on the next year to win his M.A. from Fordham in the same field.

For the past three years, Father Murray has been working toward a Master of Divinity degree at Woodstock College, N.Y. His studies completed, he expects to be engaged in retreat work at Mount Manresa, Staten Island, with a possibility later of further studies in the theology of communications.

He will celebrate his first Mass in St. Theresa of Avila Church, Albany, on Monday, May 29. Father John J. Podsiadlo the son of Mr. and Mrs. John L. Podsiadlo of 435 Bayview Road, was graduated from McQuaid in 1958 and entered the Society of Jesus immediately thereafter at the Novitiate of St. Andrew-on-Hudson, Poughkeepsie. In 1962 Father Podsiadlo transferred to Spring Hill College in Mobile, Ala. where he was awarded an A.B. in Fine Arts. In 1958 he completed a Master of Fine Arts degree in graphic design and art education at Rochester Institute of Technology. He has taught art, English and theology at Canisius High School in Buffalo for two years and instructed students at McQuaid in the same subjects from 1968 to 1969. During the summer of 1968 he also coordinated the art programs for the Rochester Cooperative Summer

Programs sponsored by the Urban Ministry Office (now the Office of Human Development).

While engaged in theological studies at Woodstock College for the past three years, he was able to take advantage of a Fulbright Fellowship to study art and architecture in Italy during the summer of 1970. And from September, 1971 until January of this year he worked in San Salvador, Central America with the "Escuelas Radiofonicas" (radio school of literacy education). Since his return he has been working on the completion of his M.Div. degree.

Father Podsiadlo will celebrate his first Eucharistic Liturgy of Thanksgiving on Memorial Day, Monday, May 29, at 5 p.m. in St. Stanislaus Church, Rochester.

In the Fall of 1967 Father Connolly was stationed at Canisius High School, Buffalo, teaching math and theology and moderating the yearbook.

During his years of theological study since 1969, Fr. Connolly has also been involved in a high school equivalency pro-

gram for adults in Harlem and in various aspects of the Catholic Renewal. He hopes to remain involved in the movement, while continuing his studies in spiritual direction and retreat giving in the Boston area.

McQuaid High School sent two of its graduates into the Society of Jesus in 1960. Father James P. Connolly, son of Mr. and Mrs. James Connolly of 929 Meigs St., and Father Michael T. Siconolfi, son of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph P. Siconolfi of 291 St. Paul Blvd., began their years of training together that summer at Bellarmine College, Plattsburgh. Both concluded their undergraduate programs at Fordham's College of Philosophy and Letters. Father Connolly continued at Fordham for a year of graduate studies in Mathematics, while Father Siconolfi earned an M.A. in Comparative Dramatic Literature from Columbia University.

Area Priest Jailed

The associate pastor of St. Monica's parish in Rochester, Father Walter J. Hanss, was among seven people from Rochester arrested in Washington on Tuesday, May 16 as part of an antiwar protest.

The seven were in Washington as part of a week of lobbying against the war sponsored by Clergy and Laymen Concerned (CALC), and were in a group of 130 arrested when they refused to leave the Rotunda of the Capitol building.

After arraignment and a plea of nolo contendere (no contest) in front of Superior Court Judge George Goodrich, four of the Rochester group, David Black, Judy Taylor, Pattie Marks and Father Hanss chose two-day jail sentences rather than pay \$25 fines.

"I am a Catholic priest," Father Hanss told Judge Goodrich at the arraignment. "It is my duty to lead my people in an effective way in matters of peace and justice. We have tried year after year to talk to our congressmen and have been rejected."

The protest followed passage of the Byrd amendment by the Senate, 47-43, ending attempts to cut off funds for the Vietnam War. After being expelled from the Senate gallery for chanting, members of CALC moved to the Capitol Rotunda, where they prayed, sang hymns, and "spontaneously and unanimously agreed to stay there come what may," according to Father Hanss.

Father Hanss told Judge Goodrich, "... together with my people and friends we prayed in a way that was visible and as honest as we could do it. I don't feel I'm guilty of any crime, but I don't deny what we did. I have the money to pay the fine, but I feel it is a ransom. So if I have to go to jail, I feel I must go."

Protesters from Rochester who paid the fine were Michael Murphy, Amos Acri, and Shea Hanford.

A reception will follow the Mass at the Basilian Fathers Residence of Aquinas Institute.

Both priests are graduates of Sacred Heart School and Aquinas.

Father Anderson graduated from the University of St. Thomas in Houston, Texas, and taught at St. Thomas High School.

Father Robbins graduated from St. John Fisher College and taught for two years at Andean High School in Gary, Ind.

Last fall, the college welcomed 70 girls to the campus for the first time in its 24 years. For the fall of 1972, enrollment of co-eds is expected to increase to 175.

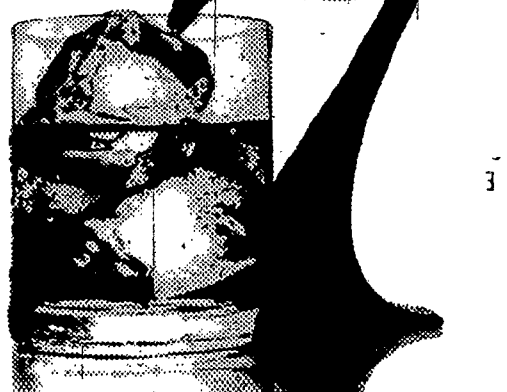
