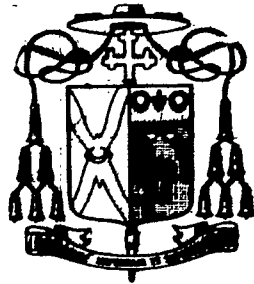

Home-School Group Hears Father Shamon

Canandaigua — St. Mary's Home School Association held their final meeting of the year Tuesday, May 16, in the school auditorium. Officers for the coming year were installed. They are: Don Clark, president; George Gillinas, vice-president; Marion Kennedy, secretary; Pat Boyd, treasurer.

Father Albert Shamon, vicar of education for the diocese, was the speaker. Father's topic was, "The New Catechetics."

In comparing the old method of teaching with the new one Father pointed out the major differences. Before, we focused on truths, today we focus on the person of Jesus Christ; yesterday we focused on the teacher, today, the student. Rather than

have the student be taught a truth, the new catechetics tries to have a child respond to a truth that he has discovered through experiences provided by the teacher.

To clarify his point, Father Shamon used a metaphor. The old method of teaching can be compared to meeting a starving man and giving him a fish but with the new method, you teach the man to fish.

Fr. Bauer Dies In Accident

A concelebrated Mass of the Resurrection will be offered for Father E. Charles Bauer Friday, 10:30 a.m. at St. Andrew's Church by Bishop Joseph L. Hogan and Father Bauer's classmates. Father Thomas Erdle will give the homily.

Thursday evening at 8 p.m. the Mass of Christ the High Priest will be offered at St. Andrew's. Bishop Dennis Hickey will preside and Father Robert Kreckel will preach.

The wake will be held at Bosco House, today, May 31, from 2-4 p.m. and 7-9 p.m., and Thursday 2-4 p.m. only. The body will then be taken to St. Andrew's Church to lie in state.

Burial will be in the priests' plot of Holy Sepulchre Cemetery.

Father Bauer, founder and director of the retarded children's program at Bosco House, died Monday. His body was recovered by scuba divers from a pond in South Bristol, Ontario County, about two hours after he fell from a floating chair Memorial Day afternoon.

Witnesses told Ontario County investigators that Father Bauer seemed to suffer a seizure while floating in the chair.

Father Bauer, a native of Rochester, graduated from St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's Seminaries and was ordained in June 1942.

He was an assistant pastor of St. Boniface, St. Francis of Assisi Church and Holy Family Church before being appointed chaplain of the Newark State School where he served 12 years.

He returned to Rochester last year to establish and direct Bosco House which was founded for the religious education of mentally retarded children.

Father Bauer was the author of several books including "Little Lessons to Live by", published two months ago.

He is survived by a brother, Orville Bauer, of Rochester.

Pope Paul Hails Talks

Vatican City — (RNS) — Pope Paul VI called for renewed confidence and hope on the eve of President Nixon's visit to Moscow.

Addressing Romans and tourists in St. Peter's Square at Noon on Pentecost Sunday, the pontiff said that at a time when important events were taking place, "including the visit of the President of the United States to Moscow," the prayer of Christians should be offered with renewed fervor. "Send forth, O Lord, your Spirit, and renew the face of the earth."

"Must we not look with the eyes of faith upon the events of our history?" the Pope asks. "For example, on the meetings at Moscow and the reconciliation of countries until now held apart by the consequences of the last inhuman conflagration."

Vatican sources said the Pope was also referring to the ratification of West Germany's non-aggression treaties with Poland and the Soviet Union.

Alluding to Vietnam and the Middle East, Pope Paul said: "Tears are not absent from our joy but neither is the comfort of new hope missing."

"Let us, therefore," he urged, "invoke the consoling Spirit of God addressing ourselves to Him, Who, through the Holy Spirit, gave the world a Savior, Jesus Christ."

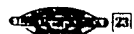
