Make Jury Probe Public Ecumenical Group Urges

Genesee Ecumenical Ministry's Judicial Process Commission is urging the grand jury investigating the May 11 clash between Rochester Police and antiwar demonstrators to present their recommendations publicly.

The commission is also recommending that there be a public and departmental assessment of the functioning of two units of the Police Bureau, the Tactical Unit and the Internal Inspection Unit.

Unless the grand jury does present its recommendations publicly, the Commission is doubtful of its adequacy as the only instrument of investigation in this or any other matter relative to police-community relations, they said at a press conference last Friday.

The Rev. Jay C. Leshar, chairman of the commission and pastor of Mt. Hor Presbyterian Church said, "This public needs to be made aware that the traditional function of a grand jury is to determine whether or not a crime may have been committed."

In its usual form, a grand jury does not intend to provide ex-

haustive investigation to satisfy public doubts in a particular matter; proceedings are secret with only the jury privy to the information, a commission statement explained.

The commission also urged that corrective steps be taken

to insure proper functioning of the Internal Inspection Unit, citing the difficulty Commission members encountered when they attempted to file complaints against police in the office set up for that purpose.
