

The Open Window



Q — It seems to me that the Church has been slow in answering the question of pornography. How is it answered in the teachings of

A. — The problem of pornography is at one and the same time very simple and very complex. Very simple because it should be evident that the deliberate arousal of the sexual instinct in a way which ignores the fact that it is a person who has this instinct is destructive of human decency and dignity. Very complex because of the difficulty of defining pornography and because the question of censorship so often enters the picture.

How does one define pornography very precisely for people of all ages, backgrounds and temperaments? The word itself comes from two Greek words meaning "writings of prostitutes". Supposedly it meant lurid accounts of their exploits. The modern meaning would embrace any graphic material directed to a self-seeking use of sexual pleasure outside its reasonable function. We speak of using a person without regard for the person but regard only for selfish desire. In the same way pormography uses that sacred faculty, sex, without regard for its sacredness.

Fortunately we are moving beyond the time when sex was regarded as something dirty and most of us realize that the mere fact of talking about or describing sexual activity is not wrong. But many factors must be considered — age and relative maturity, motivation and intention, etc. Real pornography can be devastating to the personality especially of the young. It can degenerate moral and spiritual values and create a 'What difference does it make?" attitude. It can reduce self-respect as well as respect for other persons.

When we get to the question of the "artistically or socially redeeming" aspects of such aterial, it is evident that this phrase is sometimes stretched a little beyond reason. But it is possible in a real work of art that such matter would be necessary or very useful and, in the total picture, of real value to the person.

Note should be made of the question of censorship. History has shown us that there is serious danger in allowing a government or institution or agency to determine what people may see or read. Slavery and tyranny are inevitable by-products.

So what do we do to protect ourselves against smut? We can only learn to train our children to a deeper reverence for sex and a distaste for anything which would degrade it. We must insist as a people that those who control the media use their power wisely to build up, not to break down human values.
