in facilities construction and maintenance," ending what they term "holy waste," in order to free congregational and staff energies to focus on mission and the religious needs of the community.

Other areas of concern among the clergy were what will happen to those churches already in the Gananda area, coordination of programs, keeping denominational identity, residents' reaction to absence of traditional church edifices, allocation of space in the multi-purpose center and financial responsibility.

Hospital Recovering

Building from scratch "on the premise, not promise," of federal aid, St. Joseph's Hospital is well on the way to reconstruction.

General admission is back to normal, there are 175 patients in the hospital and four babies were born there in the first few days after the maternity wing reopened July 23.

The estimated damage done to the radiology department, dietary, out-patient, rehabilitation, obstetrics, pediatrics medical arts offices, and the school of nursing is about \$8 million.

The hospital has gone ahead with reconstruction, even though they have heard nothing from the Office of Emergency Preparedness. The OEP supposedly is coming through with the necessary funds either as a grant or a loan.

Sister Martha Gersbach, associate director of St. Joseph's, said, "There is no question that Elmira needs St. Joe's so we will get money from somewhere."

are taken care of. It's been over a month since the flood, so the visible work of the Red Cross is done, what is left is the reports," Donnelly explained.

Malinda Zatkiewicz, a college senior from Dayton, Ohio, who was in Corning as a case worker, talked about last month's disaster situation. The first needs were Red Cross people with disaster training, then case workers were needed, and then "anyone with two legs who could stand."

It was the first "disaster" for Miss Zatkiewicz. She dropped out of summer school to work in Corning. She is the youngest Red Cross volunteer in the country to have served for 10 years. She began her involvement with the Red Cross when she was 13.

Fr. Sheehan

Father Peter E. Sheehan, formerly of St. John Fisher College, died July 26, 1972, in Toronto, at the age of 44. He had suffered a heart attack.

Father Sheehan, who was chairman of the theology department and dean of students at Fisher, left here in 1967 to become director of the Newman Foundation at the University of Toronto.

He was active in Rochester music circles, serving four years as chairman of the Bach Festival and two years as chairman of the Oratorio Society. He was secretary of the diocesan music committee, 1965-67.

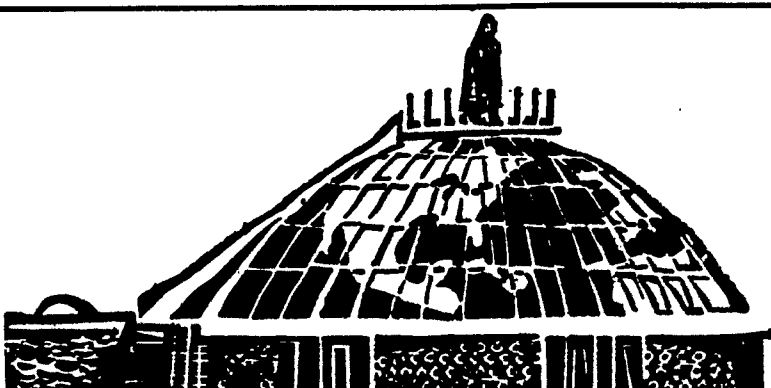
Father Sheehan was born in St. Catharines, Ont., and educated in Toronto, at the university, St. Basil's Seminary and the Royal Conservatory of Music. He was ordained a priest in the Congregation of St. Basil in 1953.
