

Farewell Slated For Father Taney

Geneva — A Maryknoll missionary, visiting his family here will be given a bon voyage Mass and reception, Sunday, Aug. 27.

Father Frank Taney, MM, who has recently been working as promotions director for the society in Seattle, Wash., and in Buffalo, will return to his first assignment as a missionary on Mindanao Island in the Philippines, on Sept. 1.

"Like MacArthur, my last words to my beloved Filipinos were, 'I shall return'." Father recently wrote in a letter to friends.

The Mass is scheduled for 2 p.m. in St. Stephen's Church and the reception will follow at DeSales High School auditorium.

Father Taney is a graduate of St. Francis DeSales School, Geneva High School and the Maryknoll College in Glen Elyn.

He was ordained in 1958 and was the founder of the parish of Compostela on Mindanao.

Cayuga Parish Moving

Cayuga — Plans are shaping up to renovate the vacated Presbyterian Church here this fall as a new home for the members of St. Joseph's Parish according to Father Edward A. Shamon, pastor.

The Presbyterian Church was built in the early 1800s by members from the Congregational Church of Aurelius. It was dedicated in 1826 and in use until a service of merger with Union Springs Presbyterian in 1961.

Father Shamon indicated the Cayuga Presbyterians wanted the vacated building to continue to be used for church purposes. It has a larger seating capacity than St. Joseph's.

The additional room is needed especially during the summer months when the lakeside cottages are occupied and attend-

ance increases. When renovated, the church will accommodate over 200 persons.

The present St. Joseph's building may be used for church and civic educational functions.

Mozambique Priest Says Colonists Kill, Torture

Utrecht, the Netherlands (RNS) — Father Luis Afonso Da Costa, a former missionary in southeast Africa, charged here that Portuguese colonists are torturing and killing innocent people in Mozambique.

The Portuguese priest brought his charge to the Central Committee of the World Council of Churches. He said he had documented proof that 92 persons were killed in the Cabora Bassa region, in northern Mozambique, between May 1971 and March 1972.

Father De Costa, 31, said he left Mozambique in May, after having been told by Portuguese authorities that he would have to leave or go to jail. He reported that 17 missionaries have been detained for questioning in recent months.
