St. Vincent's School On Regular Schedule

Corning—St. Vincent De Paul's School will open Sept. 6 for grades 1-4, thanks to the recently signed flood relief bill granting aid to private educational institutions.

Father Joseph F. Hogan, pastor of St. Vincent's, announced the opening of the school last Sunday, just five Sundays after he announced the school would close due to extensive flood damage and lack of funds to reconstruct it.

Grades 5-8 will go to Corning Catholic School South as announced earlier, and will be transported at the expense of the federal government, for this year only.

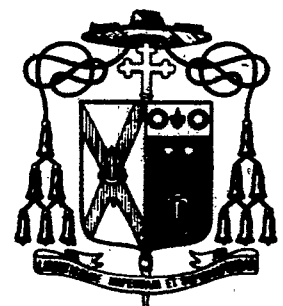
The federal government has agreed to pay for busing students in disaster areas to the schools they formerly attended, to spare them additional confusion.

Sister Mary Krokow, co-ordinating principal of the Corning Catholic School South and North said, "I think it is tremendous St. Vincent's can open. It will give stability to the parish, plus stability to children in the lower grades."

Emotional problems have been predicted in the children in flooded areas she continued because of the lack of stability all summer. The public school system is holding training workshops to prepare teachers to deal with emotional problems and the parochial school teachers have been invited to attend.
