Seminary Lists Faculty Changes

Father Healy, ordained in 1970, did graduate theology in the Washington Theological Coalition, Washington, D.C., General Theological Seminary, New York City, and Columbia University. He also did extensive work in music at Catholic University. He holds a B.A. in philosophy from Catholic University and an M.A. in theology from Columbia. He will be teaching the first year men two courses: one on Divine Revelation, the second on the Nature of the Church.

Sister Margaret Deegan will be the first woman to serve full-time on the faculty. Special lectureships have been held by women, but on a part-time basis. Sister Margaret earned her M.Th. in Liturgical Theology from the Catholic University of America this past summer. She also holds a B.S. in music from the Eastman School of Music, and is an accomplished organist. Besides teaching the Introduction to Liturgy course, she will offer an elective on the Theology of Celebration. She will direct

music program at the seminary, and will help coordinate the over-all liturgy program.

Two new appointments, announced earlier this summer, involve Capuchin friars in residence at St. Bernard's. They are Fathers Sebastian Falcone and Edmund Walker. As of June 1, Father Sebastian assumed the post of academic dean, vacated by Father David Murphy, now serving in Washington, D.C., as executive secretary of the National Catholic Education Association (Seminary Department). Father Sebastian has been teaching New Testament Studies at St. Bernard's since 1968, and has worked in adult education extensively around the diocese. He holds an S.T.L. from Catholic University, and has pursued programs of graduate studies in English, Semitic philology, and scriptural theology.

Father Edmund Walker, whose specialized field is catechetics, will team up with Father William Trott as associate spiritual

director. He is currently a candidate for the M.Th. at St. Bernard's.

Father Brennan also announced that the seminary would be offering special courses designed for or open to priests and religious, as well as qualified lay persons. These include: The Theology of Celebration (Deegan), Preacher's Seminar on Sunday Readings (team taught by Brennan-Falcone), Special Problems in the Synoptic Tradition (Falcone), Methods and Theories of Counseling (Pino), Religious Orders in the Church (McNamara), Basic Social Ethics (Logan), Recent Christology (van Torre).

For the Continuing Education for Clergy program, Father Brennan called attention to a special course in group dynamics to be taught by Father David L. Gaesser, B.A. and B.D. (St. Bernard's), M.A. (University of Rochester). This course has been designed for persons in the parish decision-making process and is intended as the seminary's contribution to the current Year of Renewal in the diocese.

• Operation Follow-Thru — is Corning family-to-family help. Those available to extend aid to others are helped by OHD to carry on support efforts in ways ranging from moral support to aid in decision making and agency contacts.

• Day Care Centers — three were set up in Corning to ensure close supervision of children in dangerous conditions while freeing parents to give maximum attention to home recovery activity. A \$30,000 grant from the Steuben County Economic Opportunity Program has enabled them to remain open.

• Helping Center — which is what the second floor of St. Vincent's school is — gives information, referrals, counseling and general kinds of assistance. Included among personnel are professional social workers on loan to OHD from area social service offices, psychiatrists, psychologists, and educational administrators.

• Data Center — created in response to the problem of duplicated surveying by various

public and private organizations. The basic survey combines data compiled by Urban Renewal, Red Cross, Corning Glass Works programs and OHD.

The psychological problems that were expected to come as the initial shock of the flood wore off are slowly rearing up. With people moved into trailers for an unknown amount of time, and cold weather threatening, there is concern about frustrations, anger and possible hostilities.

The business district of Corning and Corning Glassworks are spic and span and carrying on business as usual, but as you drive down Pultney Street to Dodge Avenue and River and Williams Streets, you know there was a flood.

"Industry has the resources and could get the collateral to respond to the need for reconstruction," Father Bayer said, citing the hamburger stand not far away as an example. It has been rebuilt and will reopen soon, while little headway has been made towards reconstruction of private homes.
