Steering Committee Meets

Horseheads — The second meeting of the steering committee of St. Mary Our Mother Church was held late last month in the church hall with four topics discussed by separate groups.

The steering committee was formed to set up a basic structure for the formation of a parish council, the next year.

Among the topics discussed at the recent meeting were the believing church, the serving Church, the listening Church and the worshipping Church.

Members of the committee studied the parish's catechetical program with relation to the believing Church, but noted that adult Christian education is needed with the CCD classes for youngsters.

Under the subject of the serving Church the committee found that although there are organizations inside the parish and Catholic groups outside of the official parish family there is no sense of unity or common cause among the organizations.

Father Bartholomew O'Brien, pastor of St. Mary Our Mother, suggested that the parish council serve as a means of coordination and communication inside the parish and possibly to coordinate work with other parishes.

The group discovered under the third subject, the listening Church, that Catholics should continue to keep listening to the Church and attempt to understand the change and growth within the Church.
