Two Faiths Join For Religious 'Ed'

Ithaca — A unique experiment in ecumenical cooperation will begin Oct. 1 in Newfield, a village in Immaculate Conception Parish.

The United Methodist Church of Newfield has offered to the Catholic church the use of the classrooms and church for religious education in that area. The offer by the Rev. Lawrence Cook and his congregation has resulted in a joint religious education program between the two churches.

In fact, the Wednesday afternoon released-time program for
grades one-eight will combine
both Catholics and Methodists
in the same classrooms, with the
same teachers. Teachers will be
from both faiths. Those serving
from Catholicism are Mrs. Kathy
Schwoeble, Sharon Kelly, and
three nuns from the Mission
Helpers of the Sacred Heart,
Sister Claire, Sister Marianna
and Sister Anthony. The second
and fourth grade preparations
for First Communion and Penance will be conducted by the
Mission Helpers.

The class material is being prepared by the Rev. Cook and Father David Mura, associate pastor at Immaculate Conception Parish, along with their respective religious education coordinators. Catholic coordinator is Mrs. Carolyn Gehring.

But the overall thrust of the Newfield program is toward the family. Every other Sunday, from 3 to 5 p.m., the Catholic families will gather (again using the Methodist Church facilities) for a two-hour Study/Prayer/Mass session. The afternoons will be thematic, beginning with "Church." During part of the time, families will be divided into

age groups — nursery, preschool, primary, junior high, high, and adult — for discussion and study of the topic. Then there will be a reunion of the whole crowd for common prayer, singing and Mass. Helen Schultz, of Immaculate Conception Parish is coordinating this effort.

Only families willing to participate in the entire program are invited

In conjunction with this, the "Marriage Encounter Program" will be encouraged for the married couples of the area (as it is hoped, couples in the entire parish will make use of this fine opportunity for strengthening their marriage and their faith.)




