

Bishop Receives 76 Men Into Nocturnal Adoration

Horseheads — Bishop Joseph L. Hogan received 76 men into the Nocturnal Adoration Society at a special ceremony in the chapel of St. Mary Our Mother here Sept. 24.

In his address to the candidates, Bishop Hogan stressed the importance of devotion to the Blessed Sacrament, suggested daily adorers as a means of keeping churches open during the day for visits, and reviewed

the theology of the presence of Christ among us.

The Nocturnal Adoration Society was canonically established on a parish level by Bishop Hogan on Aug. 21, 1972. "It gives me much pleasure to grant your petition," the Bishop wrote to Father Bartholomew J. O'Brien, the moderator, who asked the Bishop for this favor in behalf of the parish of Saint Mary Our Mother.

The parish has been divided into nine regions and the members (both men and boys) pray and meditate for one hour between 10 o'clock (on the First Friday of each month) and 7 a.m. the following morning, rotating from month to month.

New officers of the society are: president, Roy T. Van Brunt; vice president, Albert J. Purino; secretary-treasurer, Richard Pirazzolo.

Through the local newspaper, men and boys of other denominations and traditions were invited to join the members of the Nocturnal Adoration Society during their hours of prayer and meditation.

The establishment of this Eucharistic Society is one phase of spiritual renewal during the present Year of Renewal within the local parish.

MEETS WITH POPE

Elmira — In recognition of "Respect Life Week" four Elmira groups have organized a "Walk of Prayer" Saturday, Oct. 7. The sponsoring groups are The Legion of Mary, Knights of Columbus, Chemung County Right to Life Committee, and the Third Order of Saint Francis.

The program will begin with participation in the regular monthly Holy Hour sponsored by the Reparation Society of St. Patrick's Church, from 1 to 2 p.m. Participants will then walk in a group to the Dominican Monastery on West Church Street where "Respect Life Services" will be held at the Dominican Monastery at 3 p.m.

The purpose of the "walk" is "a public petition to God, through prayer, to improve the moral climate of our state and nation." The program has been planned to coincide with the Feast of the Holy Rosary.

Media 'Spots' To Help Drive

New York (RNS) — New television and radio spot announcements will be sent to all broadcasting stations in the U.S. during September to promote the third annual Campaign for Human Development, the national anti-poverty project of the Catholic Church.

Nearly \$16 million was collected in the two previous campaigns, and more than 300 grants for self-help projects for the nation's poor have already been awarded.

The eight new tapes — four for radio, four for TV — are being distributed, as in other years, through the Broadcasting and Film Commission of the National Council of Churches for "public service" use by broadcast stations.

The Campaign for Human Development collection will be taken up in Catholic churches throughout the country on Nov.
