

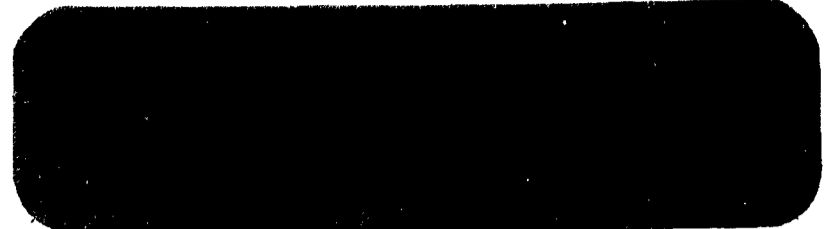
Youth Are His Concern

Father Deasio has been working with boys since he left here in 1966 to begin his priestly training in Albuquerque, New Mexico. He is a former member of

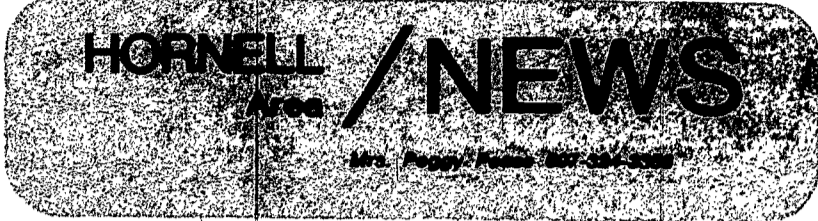
