

# Human Development Financial Statement

In the past two years over \$16 million has been collected nationally for the poor of our country. Each year, money is distributed in grants and loans to self-help projects throughout the country. Twenty-five per cent of money collected in each diocese is retained for local allocation. In the past year, five Diocesan projects have been granted national funding:

1. Auburn Housing Renovation and Manpower Development (\$42,700)—group buys and renovates homes, and gives assistance in obtaining low interest mortgages.
2. Rochester Puerto Rican Youth and Recreation Resource Center (\$20,000)—a program of youth activities to develop leadership skills among Puerto Rican youth.
3. Hilton Day Care Center (\$10,000)—to provide child care assistance for seasonal workers, resettled workers and other rural poor.
4. Fight (\$12,000)—to hire a community organizer.
5. Regional Low Income Communities Development Program—Elmira—(\$10,000)—will serve in development of low income projects and programs in Elmira area.

National grants to Rochester diocese—total: \$94,700.

en said, "and we don't expect to use them right away."

St. Augustine's parish of "older folks who don't grab on to novelty" according to the pastor, Father Edward J. Tolster, began using nuns last May.

There are three priests at St. Augustine's and "there isn't much of a need. We have only used extraordinary ministers three or four times so far," Father Tolster said.

Father Walter L. Wainwright, co-pastor of St. Joseph's, Penfield, where there have been extraordinary ministers for about two years, reported that there are 26, including one nun and two lay women.

Three nuns and seven priests help the two priests at Holy Cross, the pastor, Father Robert H. Fennessy, said. "Two priests couldn't do it," Father Fennessy said. "You'd be giving up five to seven minutes."

Father Norris agrees that extraordinary ministers "have answered the problem of undue prolongation of Mass and leaves us time to spend on music and the homily."

"And from the theological point of view it gives people a fuller participation in the Mass," he said.

The priests agreed that, over all, lay ministers have been accepted well.

"Many have a lot of difficulty coming up to a lay person, but at each Mass there is also a priest and people can choose whom to receive from," Father Norris noted.

## Rosary Leaflets

# From Rochester to Australia

Some 30,000 leaflets on the Rosary left Rochester for Melbourne, Australia, last week for distribution at the 40th International Eucharistic Congress that will take place in Melbourne Feb. 18-25, 1973.

Msgr. Joseph A. Cirrincione, director of the Family Rosary for Peace, who is leading a Courier-Journal-sponsored pilgrimage to the Eucharistic Congress, received word recently from Father Kevin Toomey, director of Pastoral Renewal in connection with the congress, that the leaflets will be distributed at two major preparatory parish meetings and on Marian Day during the congress.

The leaflet on the Rosary, entitled "Message of Our Lady of Fatima — Daily Rosary" was put out by the Bishop of Leiria-Fatima on May 13, 1971. Last summer, while on retreat at Fatima, Msgr. Cirrincione was asked to have the leaflet translated from Portuguese into English and distributed in English-speaking countries. He accepted the invitation on behalf of the Family Rosary for Peace.
