"To build community" was the theme and the objective of the Catholic High School Administrators meeting at Notre Dame Retreat House Sunday and Monday of this past week.

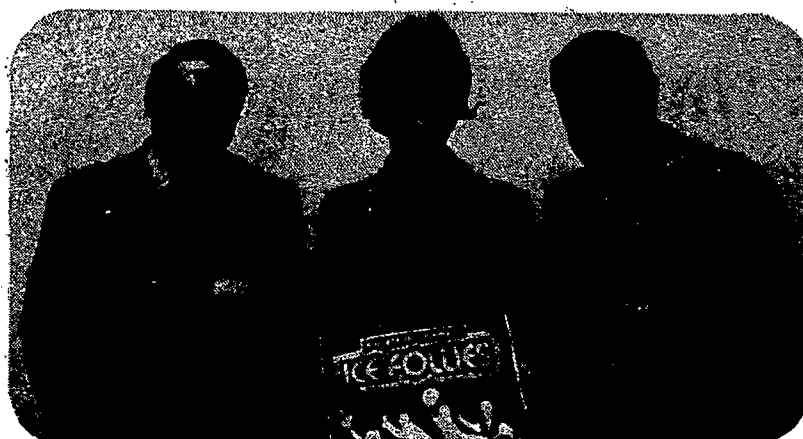

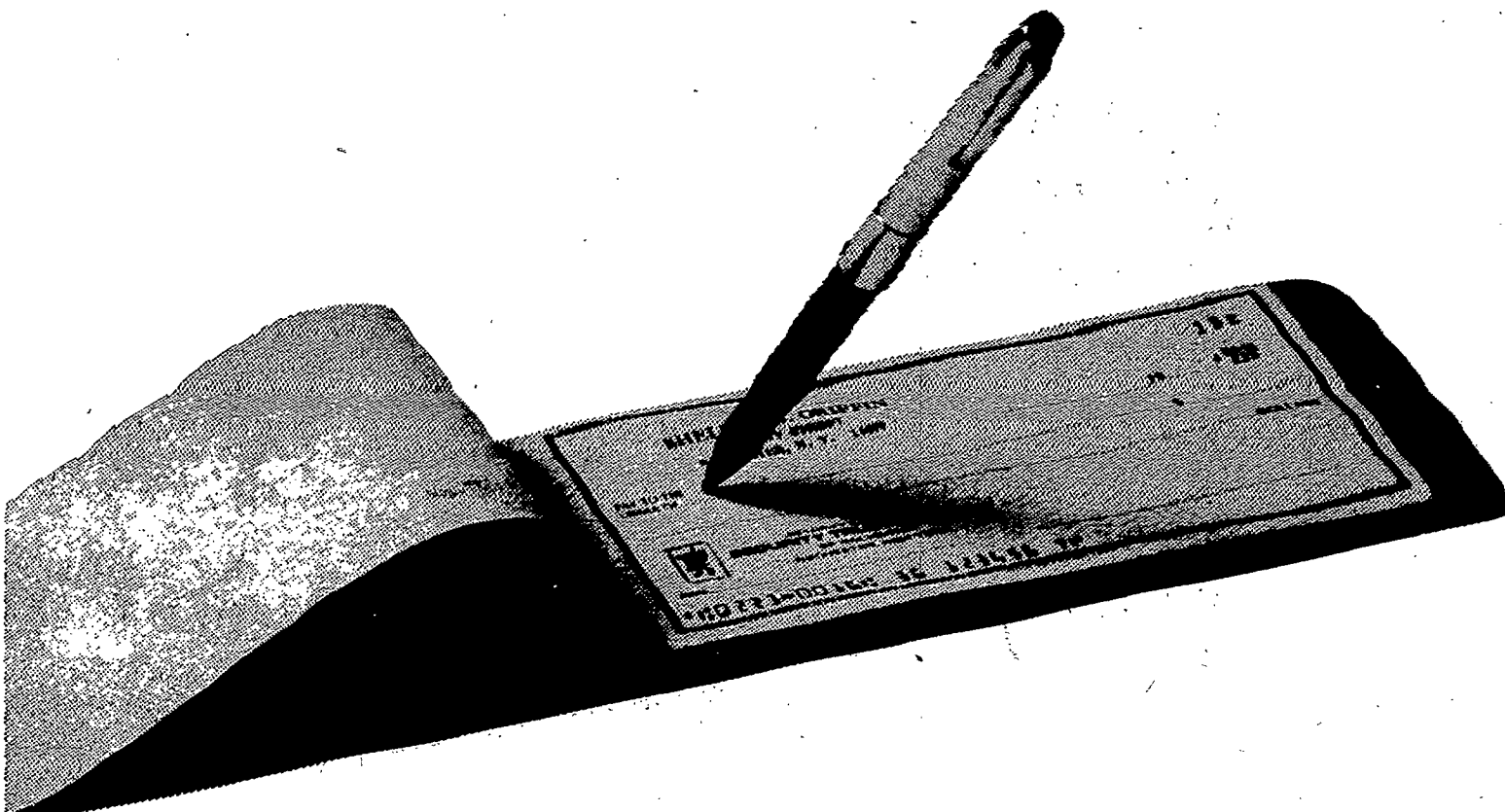
The evening's entertainment is sponsored by the Council of Inner-City Parishes and all profits will go to the maintenance of inner-city Catholic schools.
