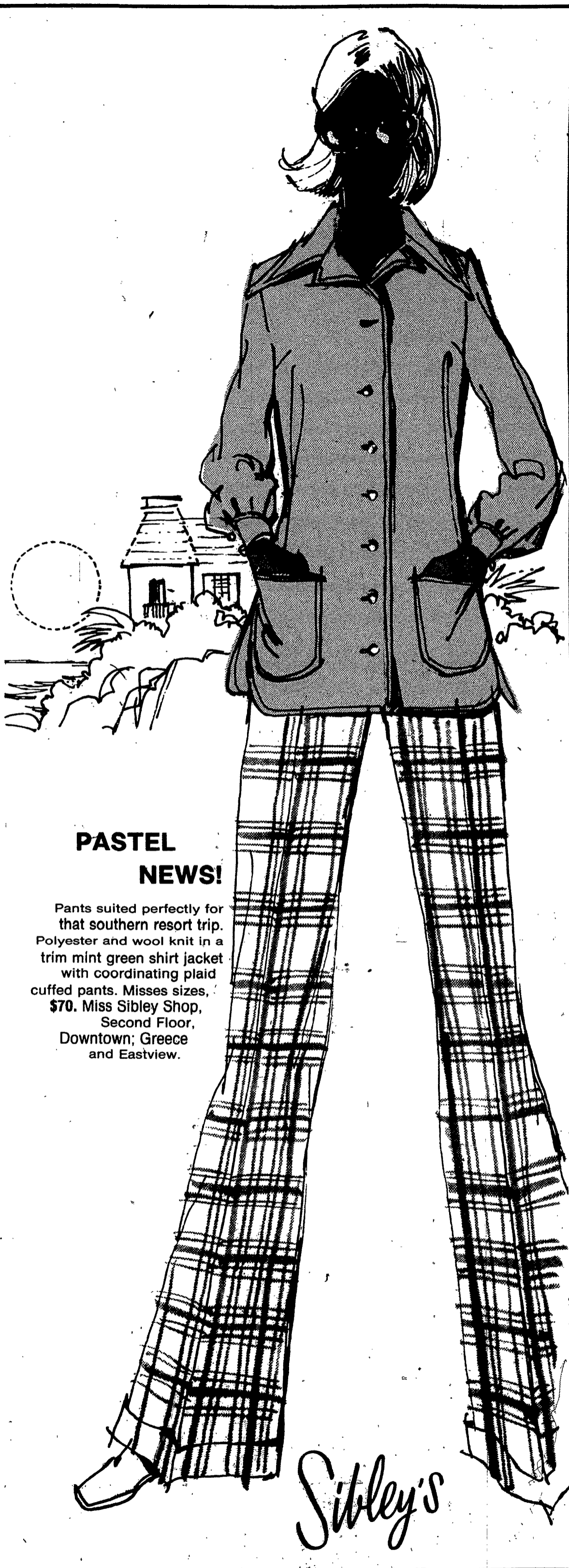
The Parents' Group of St. Monica's parish will hold a card party at 8 p.m. Friday, Nov. 17, in the meeting room on Monica Street.
