Rice Hurts Ecology?

Corning — If you want to throw rice at your wedding when it is held at St. Mary's Church here you better be ready to pay a price for the custom.

In a unique move, Father Thomas Brennan, pastor of St. Mary's, has served notice that riceless weddings, along with confettiless weddings will now be the formal way the Sacrament of Marriage will be performed in the parish.

Father Brennan in his notice recalled remarks he had made several years ago about the custom. At that time the pastor said he would study the possibility of instituting a fee to be paid by all soon-to-be-married couples for preventing the tossing of rice and confetti.

Couples who asked their guests not to throw the stuff would be refunded the fee, those who had guests who did not abide by the parish rule would lose the fee and it would be used to pay for a cleaning man.

Now Father Brennan says the original notice served to succeed in partially halting the littering, but the situation has again cropped up.

"Now that everyone is aware of ecology, it should not be hard to put an end to the senseless practice of littering the church and its immediate environs.

"This notice is intended to prepare our brides and grooms for the institution of a fee if the violations of the no-litter request continue," the Pastor concluded.

A need currently exists for persons to join the board who have interest in all levels and aspects of religious education activities.

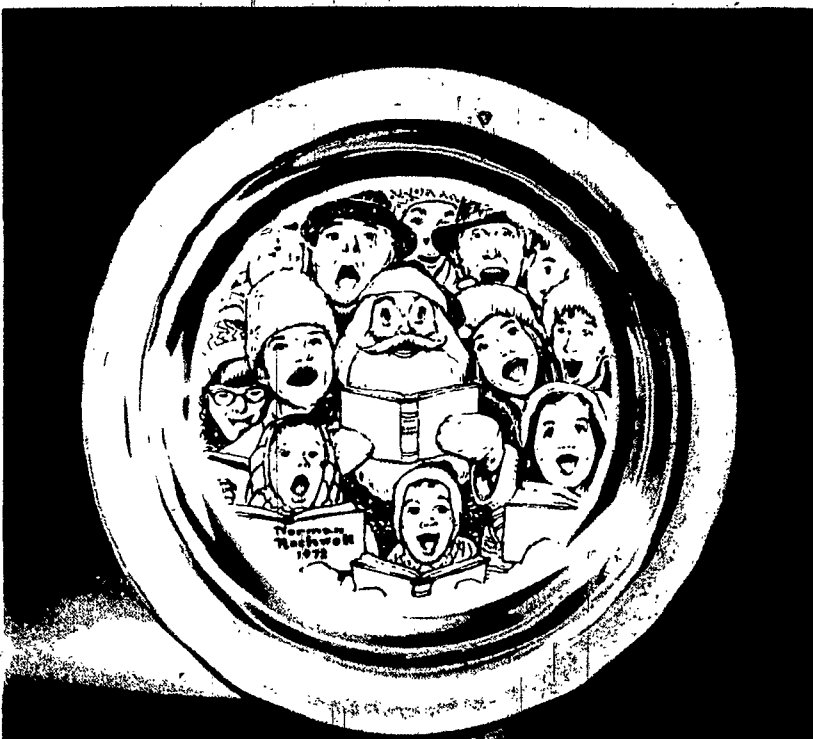
