Elmira — Elderly flood victims who have been housed at the Mark Twain Hotel since August will be able to smile at Christmas this year thanks to the generosity of area residents.

Sister Juliana O'Hara, coordinator of aging programs at the hotel for the Office of Emergency Preparedness (OEP) said a special Christmas Party is scheduled for 5 p.m. Thursday for the senior sitizens.

The party will be complete with presents, a musical program and a buffet dinner.

The 50 flood victims plus 70 "alumni" residents of the facility who have since moved back to their homes or to new permanent residences will be feted.

In addition to providing food for the affair, Metz Associates. the organization which caters for the flood victims at the hotel, will also have a Santa Claus on hand plus a cash donation for extraordinary expenses.



The elderly residents are allowed to live at the hotel for up to one year rent free. While they are living at the hotel efforts are being made by the federal government's Department of Housing and Urban Development to find them permanent housing.
