Corning — The Right to Life Committee recently sponsored a special Mass and prayer service here to commemorate the feast of the Holy Innocents. The service was held at St. Vincent dePaul Church.

Father Thomas F. Brennan, pastor of Corning's St. Mary's Church, told the more than 250 persons in attendance that the killing of innocent unborn of today, could be compared to the killing of infant boys by King Herod more than 2,000 years ago. He called both incidents "pagan."

Prayers were recited for doctors, to help them protect life and to come forward on behalf of the unborn child.

Prayers were also offered for women who choose to abort.

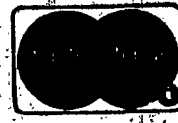
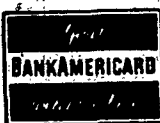

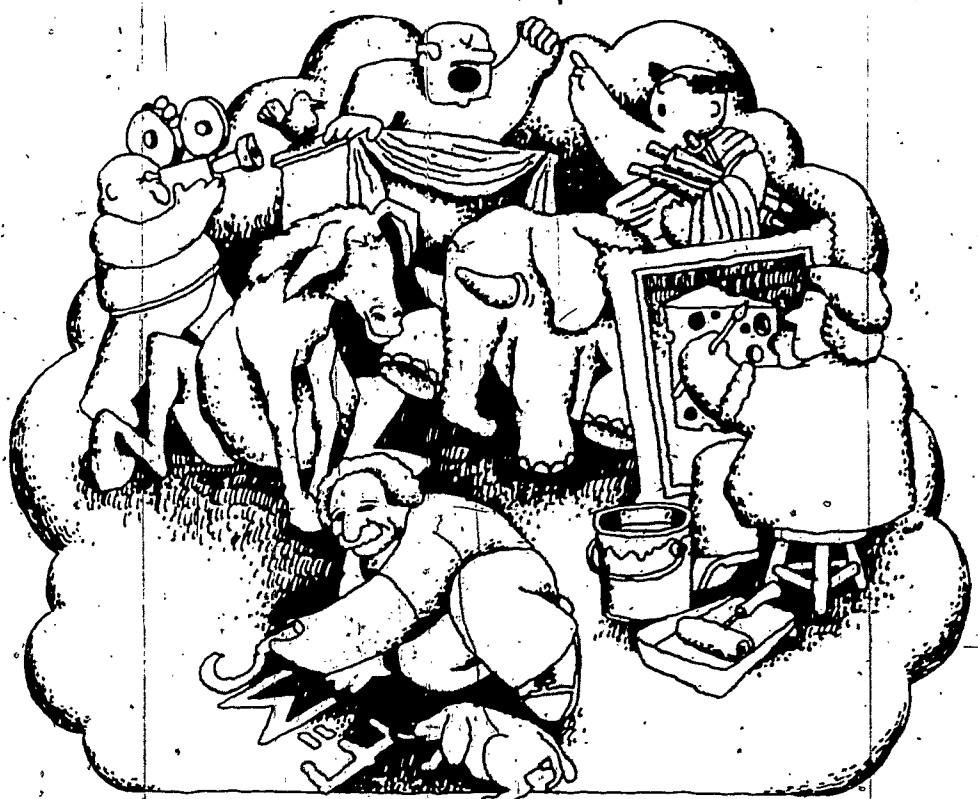
