Regional Workshop Set for Auburn

Auburn — The Regional Worship Committee of Cayuga and Seneca Counties will hold workshops at St. Alphonsus School from 2 to 6 p.m., Sunday, Jan. 28. Parish worship committees, priests and others interested in the liturgy are invited.

"With many parish liturgy committees struggling to understand what they are all about and what they can do in the parish, this workshop is designed to answer this question," explained Father Edward Palumbos, chairman of the Regional Worship committee. "Also included in the scope of the workshop will be special training for lecturers."

The keynote address, "What is the Role of Liturgy in the Life of the Parish," will be given by Father L. John Hedges, Pastor of St. Charles Borromeo Church in Rochester.

A workshop on parish communication will be directed by Father Robert Smith, pastor of St. Januarius Church in Naples. "Parish worship committees," with the St. Charles Borromeo worship committee, mostly laymen, will deal with "How to get underway; what we do at St. Charles." "How to prepare a thematic liturgy" will be con-

ducted by St. Mary's worship committee of Auburn.

All parishes in the Auburn Region are expected to send their lecturers to a workshop which will examine "The theology of proclaiming the Scriptures and techniques and tips in reading." This will be presented by Professor Joseph Kelly, scripture professor at St. Bernard's Seminary, and Father William Graf, homiletic and pastoral theology professor at St. Bernard's.

Liturgical reform approved by Vatican II allows expanding potential of Scripture and the introduction of a variety of eucharistic prayers. This workshop is geared to help the layman to understand the liturgy.

"I feel that people are looking for reasons why we are doing some of the things we do," Father Palumbos commented. "This will help people appreciate the theology out of which liturgical changes naturally flow. It will also give guidance to those parishes contemplating the richness of liturgical changes available to them, but who need to be brought up to date on the changes open to them."

A Mass will conclude the program. A \$1 registration fee will be charged.

New Lights Installed In Canisteo Church

Canisteo — About three years ago, when Father Otto Vogt of St. Joachim's Church learned that his own hometown parish of St. Joseph's, Wayland, was going to renovate their church, he thought that the lights might be appropriate and a welcome addition to the beauty of the interior of St. Joachim's.

When Father Vogt suggested to the then pastor of St. Joseph's, Father James Marvin, that the lights could be put to good use in his church, Father Marvin replied, "We are happy that they will be welcomed by the Canisteo parishioners."

"So," Father Vogt said, "we picked the best of them and brought them over to Saint Joachim's."

During December of 1972, 10 men (who do not want to be named) made the lights ready for installation. They were cleaned and rewired and placed at 5 foot intervals on each side of the ceiling. There are three lights on each side which now makes it possible to remove the existing center fixture which takes on the appearance of an inverted crown.

The new lights are of English Tudor style, rather elongated and casting varying degrees of light as desired. Father Vogt and his parishioners have voiced very much approval and they

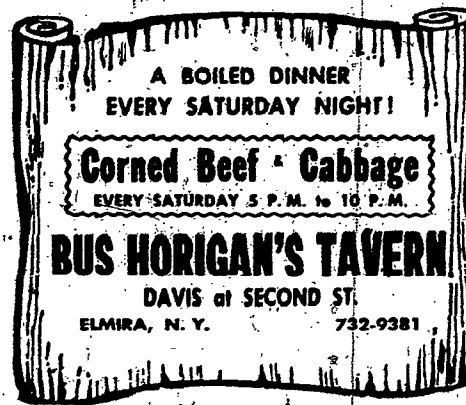
