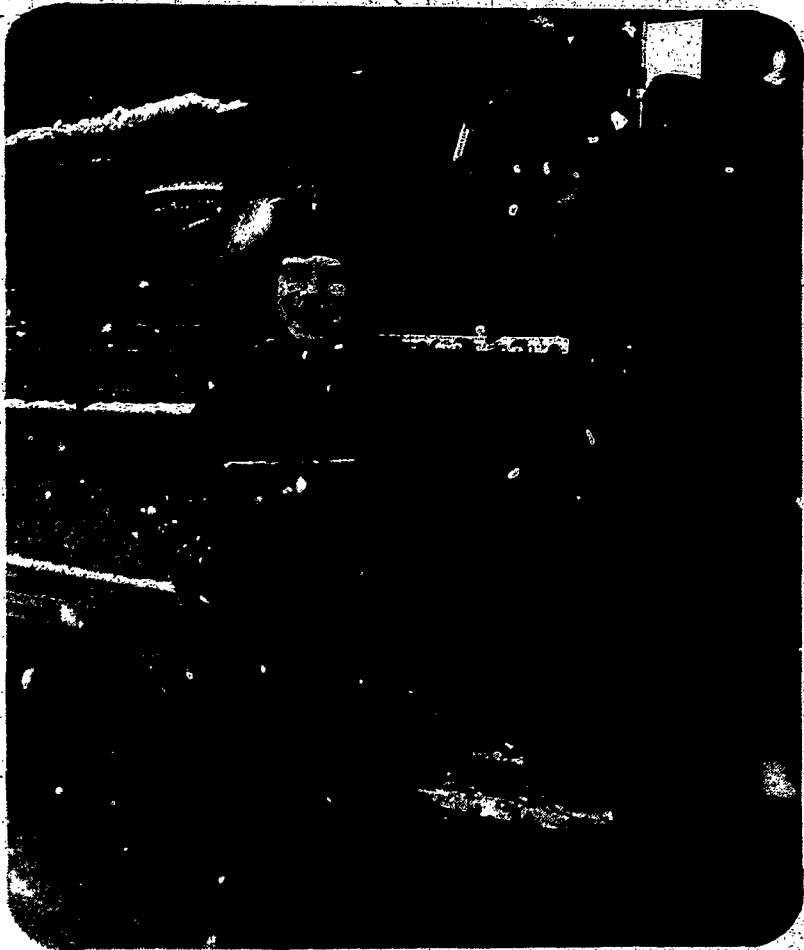




### Happy Samaritans

### Quit, Priests Ask Bishop

Liverpool (RNS) — A Roman Catholic bishop's resignation has been asked for here by a group of priests because of statements he made on birth control. His superior has termed the priests' charges as unfair.

Central figure in the dispute is Auxiliary Bishop Augustine Harris of Liverpool who spoke about birth control in a BBC program.

Bishop Harris, during the telecast, was questioned about the case of a Roman Catholic woman taking the pill.

In reply he said he would tell the woman: "In your confusion you have come to this decision that you must use the pill. You must use it — and at the same time do try . . . keep on praying . . . keep on looking for the truth. Go to the sacraments as Pope Paul told you to, and then God will look at you and God will love you."

The program has a wide audience. Leaders of the Catholic Priests' Association wrote to the Liverpool see to call for his resignation.

### Pa. Distributes Private School Aid

Harrisburg, Pa. (RNS) — Gov. Milton Shapp announced here that \$7.5 million has been paid to education units to aid children attending non-public schools in Pennsylvania.

The payments, which were authorized under a law adopted last July, went to public education "intermediate" units, which will then purchase equipment for loan to non-public schools.
