Canandaigua — The building of a parish council at St. Mary's has been a slow and quiet process. This has been a deliberate tactic by Father William Charbonneau, pastor.

His aim has been to get people who were really interested in a particular group to serve in that area. His first approach was a simple announcement in the bulletin of the beginnings of a council and of the committees that would be formed.

Next, he called for those who

would be generous enough to give time and energy; working with one committee at a time.

Four committees have been formed — Finance, Building and Grounds, Liturgical and Human Development. The committees average eight people and are just beginning to function. A Steering Committee also is being formed.

Mental Health Commentary

Question: My 12½ year old son was caught taking women's underclothing from a neighbor's apartment. He has also taken such apparel from his older sister. He said he likes to wear them. Is this a passing phase for this age or should it be considered an indication for seeking professional help?

Answer: Such behavior is categorized under "gender identity disturbance" and may be episodic and of short duration, particularly in the age group you mention.

On the other hand, it may be an early sign of a personality disorder which may lead to problems in personality maturation of a significant degree. Research at Johns Hopkins Children's Hospital has demonstrated that by the age of two years the child has developed a concept of his being a boy or girl.

Children in their growing years are taught to identify with both sexes, this is, with both father and mother but are more strongly oriented in terms of their biological and anatomical sexual determinants.

Both boys and girls may go through periods of wishing they belonged to the opposite sex. This is more common with girls. If these fantasies are episodic and transient, there may be little residuum. However, when they are persistent, even in pre-adolescent children, concern is indicated.

The kind of behavior you described in an early adolescent boy may be an episodic, exploratory venture. This would be of less significance than if it were a repetitious behavior. Causes could be cited only after adequate study. It is preferable to refer a boy such as you described to a child guidance clinic rather than to the Family Court on a juvenile delinquency charge.
