# **Corning Priests Fight Abortion**

Corning — Eight Corning and Painted Post priests have joined together in an effort to counteract a movement by pro-abortion supporters.

In a two page statement the eight priests, who head four parishes in the area, said, "The

press recently reported the plan of certain citizens of our community to seek two thousand signatures to a statement in favor of contraception and abortion and calling for the appropriation of and use of public monies-to finance such prac-

"We must speak out in the plainest and most earnest terms to remind our congregations of the teaching of holy Mother Church on the immorality of the act of taking the life of an infant living within the shelter of his mother's womb.

They also said, "The fact that seven of the nine justices of the Supreme Court have legalized this act of the destruction of human life does not endow the sin of abortion with rectitude.'

The priests said the most obvious deterrent to taking a human life is God's law which says "Thou shalt not kill."

They also explained that Catholics are not the only persons opposed to abortion. "Protestant and Jewish clergymen and laypersons have spoken out in


