many other victims of the June flood. Her brick home was the only house on the street to withstand major structural damage. With the help of her family, she moved back into her house following extensive interior overhauling.

As in any disaster, the flood left more than high water marks in its wake. The feelings of discouragement hit worst during the long winter months.

Two letters mailed daily by the children for several weeks prior to the visit became highlights of Mrs. Scianni's day. The class on its own initiative remembers her in their morning classroom intentions and still writes to her. The continuing contact is part of the philosophy behind the interest in the adoptive family sponsored by the TLC program.

TLC was initiated by the diocesan Office of Human Development as a means to help the discouragement of people who are not poverty cases, but rather victims of an unfortunate circumstance.
