U.S. Bishops to Meet Regionally

Washington, D.C. (RNS) — Revising their annual conference schedule, the nation's Roman Catholic bishops have slated 12 regional meetings in April and May, replacing the Spring plenary session of the past few years.

A common agenda will be utilized, however, keying on such topics as pro-life activities in the framework of the U.S. Supreme Court abortion decision, youth and the Church, marriage and family life in the Christian context and a variety of other issues.

The regional meetings will be organized geographically, corresponding to the 12 regions of the National Conference of Catholic Bishops (NCCB). Reports from each regional meeting will be forwarded to Washington, compiled, and presented to the NCCB Administrative Committee. The committee will review conclusions and refer recommendations for action to the November general meeting of the NCCB.

Priests, religious and laity are expected to take part in the 12 meetings as non-voting participants.

Region II (New York) will meet April 30 to May 2, Syracuse; Cardinal Terence Cooke of New York will be chairman.
