Shouldn't the Church also oppose smoking since it has been proven that this causes or hastens death? What is the difference between taking an overdose of sleeping pills and smoking two packs a day for 10 years? Aren't taking drugs, drinking and smoking really suicide in slow motion? Please give me a real answer and not a cop-out?

A. Your theology is remarkable and refreshing. What you say is correct in every instance as long as you see there is quite a difference between direct and immediate suicide and suicide in slow motion, as you so aptly call it. The fact is, both are suicide and I don't really know why the Church has not come out against smoking. Of course as a heavy smoker or 30 years who quit entirely only recently I am perhaps in a precarious position to defend your thesis. obvious that it is not as serious a wrong to shorten life by 10 years as it is to shorten your life by 50 years. But I think they both really are serious.

Also I must modify your position, on drunkenness. The Church is opposed to drunkennes primarily because it "turns off" one's humanness, at least for a time, making it impossible to act as an intelligent free person. But it does disapprove drinking insofar as it shortens life and harms health.

It is important to remember that drink taken in moderation does no appreciable harm to health. When taken consistently in overdose it wreaks havoc on body and mind and is seriouslywrong. The same thing could be said about excessive eating which almost always leads to heart

disease.

One point I must make in conclusion. Don't too easily judge people who are hung up on smoking. I know from experience that it is terribly difficult to quit and make the proper physical and psychological adjustments. I never know from day to day when I might succumb and get hooked again. The best advice I could give to the young is don't start. It
