Chrism to the altar. A nurse carried the oil of the sick and a confirmand presented the oil of catechumens.

Organizers of the liturgy, who had worked for the past several months developing the themes of the Mass, placed special emphasis on the varieties of ministry within the "priesthood" of the faithful.

This was done by making strong regional identifications of the congregation and by a "Rite of Commitment in Ministry" which followed the Homily.

During this rite, Bishop Hogan asked the assembly to renew itself and "to contribute to the building up of Christ's body in each of your regions."

Clergymen Transferred

Two changes in associate pastorates were announced this week by the Pastoral Office.

Father Winfried Kellner, will move from Assumption Church, Fairport to St. Andrew's Church.

He holds a B.A. degree from St. John Fisher College, an M.A. degree from the University of Rochester, and B.D. and M.Th. degrees from St. Bernard's Seminary.

While attending St. Bernard's Seminary, Father Hart was associated with the field placement programs at the Rochester School for the Deaf, the Catholic Family Center, the Department of Philosophy at the University of Rochester, and Holy Name of Jesus Parish. Public receptions are planned immediately following the Ordination Mass and Masses of Thanksgiving.


Even though the rites viewed last week have gone through extensive revision and updating, Bishop Hogan, in a surprising move, incensed the altar at the Offertory in Latin, the ancient tongue of the Church.

The rite also was remarkable in that it was held in a church other

than the Cathedral and on a day other than Holy Thursday.

Again, the burgeoning regionalism of the diocese was cited as a reason for the changes to a more centrally located church at a more convenient time.
