Pope Renews Peace Appeal

Vatican City [RNS] — Pope Paul has hinted that South Vietnamese President Nguyen Van Thieu feels there is a definite lack of public support for peace among some people in his own country, as well as in nearby nations (presumably North Vietnam, Laos, Cambodia).

The pontiff told a weekly general audience April 11 that "a chief of state" had recently commented to him in an audience that the "peace in Southeast Asia is 'fragile.'"

The Pope did not mention anyone by name but the reference was considered an obvious one to Mr. Thieu, who had met with the pontiff only two days earlier during a brief visit in Rome.

"Peace in the world is very precarious at this time," the spiritual leader warned, and then added the explanation:

"We were talking about this recently with a chief of state who made this remark, 'Peace is fragile because it lacks the support of all public opinion in its own home or in the neighboring homes or states.'"

To counteract this public apathy toward peace, the Pope urged that it be made "ever stronger" rooted in the conscience of the people: What is needed to strengthen peace is this collective persuasion and the help of God.

"Let no one be invaded by a feeling of boredom," he said, adding: "This is not new. There has even been too much talk about peace."

Pope Tells Youth:

Let Jesus Be Your Guide

Vatican City [RNS] — Pope Paul VI opened the solemn services of Holy Week on Palm Sunday by urging young people to look to Jesus Christ, if they want to change the world for the better.

The 75-year-old pontiff conceded that the youth of today have good reason to be dissatisfied with conditions of modern life, but he warned that "contest," and "rebellion" are not the ways to change the world.

Instead, the Pope called on his listeners at a noon service in St. Peter's Basilica to accept Jesus Christ as "the light and the salvation of the world."

The spiritual leader of the world's more than 630 million Roman Catholics delivered his Palm Sunday homily from a throne in the basilica where he

offered Mass in observance of Christ's entry into Jerusalem and the start of the week-long services that will culminate with Easter — the day on which Christian teaching says Christ rose from the tomb.

The Pope blessed and distributed olive branches and palms which are the symbols of those strewn in the path of Jesus as he entered the Holy City almost 2,000 years ago.

The ceremony was broadcast on Italian television. More than 15,000 Romans and pilgrims from around the world attended the ceremony in the huge basilica.

Pope Paul blessed the crowd before he distributed the palm and olive branches to a group that included prelates, clergymen, religious, youths and some invalids.

Syracuse Bishop Endorses Amnesty

Syracuse [RNS] — Amnesty for conscientious objectors to the Vietnam war and economic aid to both North and South Vietnam were strongly recommended here by the Roman Catholic Bishop of Syracuse.

In a Lenten statement published (April 11) in The Catholic Sun, the diocesan newspaper, Bishop David Cunningham declared his firm belief "that our Christian faith requires us to embrace in charity and economic aid" all the people of Vietnam.

Drawing a distinction between war resisters and draft evaders and stressing that his statement followed closely the position of the U.S. Catholic bishops, Bishop Cunningham evinced support for "the young men who in sincere

The pontiff had high praise for what he termed the desire of youth for "peace and love" but cautioned that "reckless indiscipline, so common today, goes contrary to Christ's teaching."

He told the youths that Christ is "the key to our existence... the peace, the life, the love, the way. His generosity is the model for all humanity."

The pontiff strongly criticized what he termed "Machiavellian" politics in which he said "selfishness rules the destinies of nations."

Instead, he called for a "legitimate and dutiful defense of one's own welfare inspired by love, moderated by justice, fitted into peace."

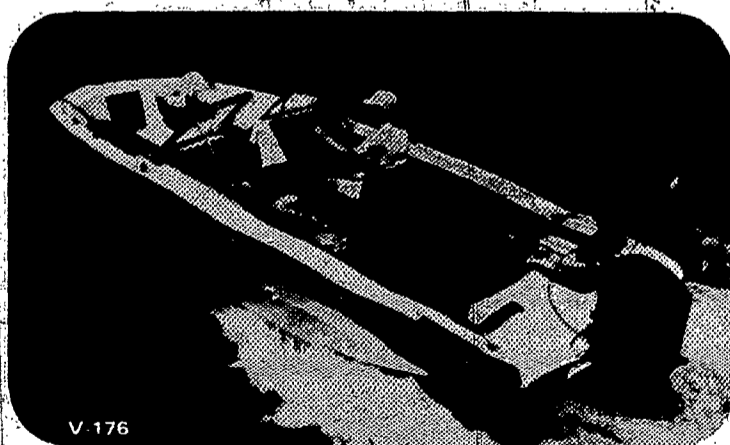
