She was supposed to exclaim how cute he looked. Instead she looked at the super lush greenness of the backyard and exclaimed, "Pennsylvania! But, I thought the whole state was given over to coal mining and steel production, etc., etc., etc.,

I informed her as best I could as to her mistake but I shrink to think how many other people have the same mistaken notion about the state where I grew up and which will always be home.


NAVY HONORS YMCA
