Chili Church to Be Dedicated

A Mass and dedication by Bishop Joseph L. Hogan will officially open the doors of St. Pius Tenth Church in Chili on Sunday, May 20. The new church was built entirely by the parishioners, according to its pastor, Father Lawrence Murphy.

Ground was broken for the new structure in the summer of 1971. Work progressed rapidly enough that services could be held in the

new building by January 1972 but because the church windows were to be made by Muriel Pulitzer, an artist in France, and because pews had to be removed from the old church and placed in the new one, completion was delayed.

It took two years before the structure was finished.

The new church seats 900,

replacing a building which could hold a maximum of 450. The old structure has been converted into a gymnasium for the adjoining parish school.

Father Murphy proudly noted that the parish now has a new church worth \$150,000 which still leaves the parish debt-free, because all the work was done by parishioners without the aid of an architect or general contractor.

12 Deacons Assigned to Parishes

Twelve St. Bernard's Seminary deacons who have finished four years of theological preparation, were named to intern-assignments as special assistants in diocesan parishes by Bishop Joseph L. Hogan according to Father Edward E. Steinkirchner, director of interns.

Those appointed are: Rev. Mr. Ronald Antinarelli, Rev. Mr. Louis Sirianni, Rev. Mr. James Hewes, Rev. Mr. Francis Blighton, Rev. Mr. Dennis Shaw, Rev. Mr. William Leone, Rev. Mr. William Spilly, Rev. Mr. Robert Gaudio, Rev. Mr. Robert Kennedy, Rev. Mr. James Callan, Rev. Mr. Gerald Wahl, and Rev. Mr. Jeremiah Moynihan.

The pastor in each parish is officially designated as the deacon's "supervisor" for the inservice training in parish work. The deacons will be ordained to the priesthood in the Spring of 1974.

Bishop Hogan inaugurated the deacon-intern program in early 1970.

The seven priests ordained this spring are completing their first year of internship and are awaiting assignments in June. According to the personnel guidelines of the diocese, they will join the ranks of seven other intern priests already serving in parishes, and they will serve three years as priest interns with supervising pastors. At the end of the intern period, they will be considered to have full professional status, and they will be qualified for a co-pastorate or associate-pastorate.

The deacons will perform all the duties of the ordinary assistant in the parishes with the exception of celebrating the Eucharist and the Sacraments of Penance and of the sick. They will baptize, preach, distribute Holy Communion, take communion to the sick, witness marriages and direct Scripture Services.

They will also be expected to assist in parish youth work, help in pre-marriage instructions and investigations and, assist in

religious education programs of children and adults.

For his services the deacon will receive from the parish a basic salary plus room and board and a car allowance.

The appointments are effective June 27.
