# Helping Mom Helps Kids

The Rochester Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Children has set up a training course for new recruits to its Homemaker Services for Children. A refresher course is offered for those who already have worked in this program.

Homemaker Services, organized in cooperation with many social service agencies in Monroe County, has been provided since 1938. Its purpose is to keep families functioning normally in times of stress, when a mother is ill or for any reason unable to handle household routine.

Training includes Red Cross home nursing, nutrition and home management instruction given by Rochester Gas and Electric Company home economists. A

special course in the care of handicapped or emotionally-disturbed children will be provided by the Day Care Training Center.
