

## Belgian Priest Named Delegate

Vatican — Father Jean Jadot, a 63-year-old Belgian priest, has been named the Vatican's Apostolic Delegate to the United States.

Cabon, Africa, the Belgian priest will be the first non-Italian papal envoy to the United States.

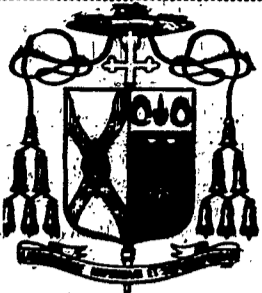
Though the United States and the Vatican do not maintain formal diplomatic relations, the Apostolic Delegate has contact

## Religious Units Hit Bombing

New York [RNS] — A brief contesting the legality of U.S. air attacks in Cambodia has been filed in U.S. District Court in Brooklyn, N.Y., by five national religious organizations.

The amici curiae (friends of the court) brief, which was filed in connection with a suit made by Rep. Elizabeth Holtzman (D-N.Y.) against the Secretaries of Defense and Air Force, was presented on behalf of the Council for Christian Social Action of the United Church of Christ, the Union of American Hebrew Congregations, National Catholic Conference for Interracial Justice, National Coalition of American Nuns, and the United Presbyterian Church.

In the brief, the religious groups charge that nearly 80 per cent of the U.S. air strikes have been directed against Cambodian rebels, although such action has not been authorized by Congress. They assert that "the war in Cambodia is not the same as the war in South Vietnam. The combatant are different, the areas are different and the issues are different."

The document states that a separate Congressional declaration of war is constitutionally required for each enemy under attack, and maintains that "there is little if any precedent for authorizing the President to take part in a 'conflict' and attack whomever he chooses."

Among the questions raised by the religious groups in the brief are the following: "Should an authorization to attack North Vietnam carry an implication of authority to attack troops of an allied power? What if they are Chinese? Russian? Where does the authority stop?"

First Lt. Arthur Watson, an Air Force officer stationed in Guam, had joined with Rep. Holtzman in filing the original suit. They had asked the court for a declaratory judgment against the continuing of U.S. military action in Cambodia without Congressional authorization, and for a restraining injunction if necessary.

In explaining why they filed an amici curiae brief in the case, the five religious organizations said that they are "directly affected in a financial and material sense by the continuation and extension of United States military operations," because they supply military chaplains, minister to combatants and their families, and support mission activities in the area.

They also emphasized that they place "high value on the sanctity of human life... not limited by racial, religious or national groupings." The petitioners held that religious efforts to "foster a brotherhood of man will be frustrated by the continuation of massive air attacks on Asian peoples."

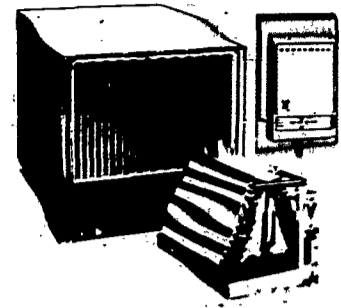
