Tour to Krakow Planned

Mayor Stephen May has announced plans to lead a Rochester delegation to Krakow, Poland, in July to sign the Sister City Charter with Rochester's newest Sister City. He urged interested Rochesterians to join him in what he termed a "unique opportunity to visit America's first Sister City behind the Iron Curtain and to strengthen the historic bonds of friendship with the people of this beautiful, cultural city."

May said the Sister City tie "by offering opportunities for increased person-to-person contacts and first hand experiences, will open a new chapter in the long history of Polish-American friendship. It is enthusiastically endorsed by the United States Department of State," he emphasized.

Joining May in leading the tour will be Felix Banachowski of 20 Chevalin St., who is chairman of the Krakow-Rochester Sister City Committee.

The group will also visit Austria and Switzerland, but the Mayor stressed that the highlight of the tour will be the official ceremony in Krakow on Thursday, July 19 where he and Krakow Mayor Jerzy Pekala will sign the Sister City Charter linking the two cities.
