## Fr. Bernardine Celebrates 30th

Father Bernardine Ward, OFM, a native of Rochester, and a Bolivian missionary, this year celebrates his 30th anniversary as a priest.

Father Bernardine was a member of St. Monica's Parish, and graduated from Aquinas Institute in 1932 before entering the Franciscan order.

He began his missionary activity in Mexico a year after his 1943 ordination. After 11 years there, he went to Puerto Rico for nine years, six of which he served as Franciscan superior there.

In 1963 Father Bernardine went to the Franciscan mission in Bolivia, where he has since remained.

## 3 Now Jailed In Vatican

**Vatican City [RNS]** — As of May 25, three men were held in the Vatican jail, and their arrests may provide a clue to recurrent thefts here in recent years.

The Vatican spokesman Federico Alessandrini said on May 25 that two more Vatican employes have been arrested in the theft of "precious medals." A Vatican telephone technician has been in jail for nearly three weeks in the same case.

The spokesman declined to give the identities of the three. Sources said two more Vatican technicians were involved in the case. One reportedly has been fired. The other has been briefly held for questioning by Italian police and then released on bail, the sources said.

"Precious" medals, coins and stamps have been disappearing from Vatican buildings at various intervals during the past few years. The Vatican has officially confirmed only a few thefts, but officials privately admitted that the Holy See was worried by "frequent disappearances."

The 16 associate pastors reassigned include two former pastors, Msgr. Arthur E. Ratigan, who has returned from sick leave to work at St. John the Evangelist, Greece, and Father Leo J. Matuszewski, who left the pastorate of St. Patrick's, Owego, to serve at St. Mary of the Lake, Ontario.

Father George Gauthier, who will be an associate at Mt. Morris,

is with the Office of Human Development, and will move from Tioga County to Livingston County headquarters.

The appointments take effect June 27.

Father Shamon, a former teacher and a writer of many books and pamphlets, returns to parish work after three years in the full-time education department post. From 1961 until 1970 he was pastor of St. Patrick's, Victor, and in addition, 1967-1970, served as vicar for religious education. For years he has supplied the Courier-Journal with a weekly commentary, The Word for Sunday. He was ordained in 1940.

Father O'Connell, a priest since 1936, was assigned in 1959 to St. Mary's, where he built a school addition, a convent and a rectory, all finished by 1964. He had served as pastor earlier for four communities on Lake Ontario — Sodus, Sodus Point, Wolcott and East Bay — all at the same time, and then at St. Mary on the Lake Ontario.

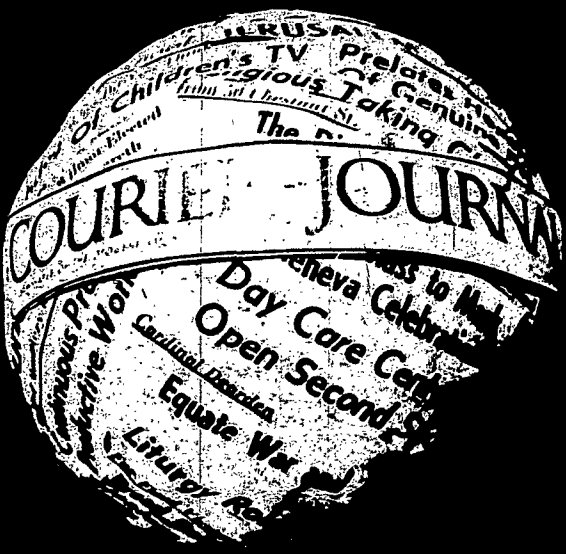
