

Group Resumes Operations

The red, white and blue booths of the Monroe County Coalition for Voter Registration will be seen again at supermarkets, high schools and even carnivals despite an effort in the State Legislature to squelch the volunteer program.

A bill defeated in a Senate committee in May called for voting registration only by regular, paid personnel. In essence, "there would be no mobile registration program for Monroe County," said Susan Dollinger, recruitment and training coordinator for the coalition. She describes the volunteer plan as a "non-political service to make the voting process more convenient," and said the County could not afford to pay for such a service.

The coalition registered 3,000 high school students in the Spring and will begin its Summer program July 2. A training session for volunteers will be held at 7:30 tonight at 39 W. Main St., in the legislative chambers.

Formerly, voters were able to register only during office hours at the Board of Elections downtown, or at their polling places on certain weekends in The Fall.

Voting is the key to a better neighborhood, says Father Charles Mulligan, coalition chairman and director of the Office of Human Development, a support group for the coalition.

"There is an immense amount of administrative paper work in getting a service out to millions of people. The coalition's purpose is to stimulate help for the program since through it, we can better the conditions of the neighborhood."

Primarily the search for volunteers has been focused on the media, but Father Mulligan

looks forward to getting parishes involved in the key areas.

Key areas are those with low registration. Priority sites for the summer include the 3rd, 7th and 16th wards of the city, and the Hilton-Sweden and Henrietta-Wheatland areas. Mobile booths also will be set up at Midtown Plaza and Greece Town Mall. Factories, nursing homes and other special sites will be covered.

Last year, 31,000 people were registered. Of these 90 per cent went on to vote. According to the coalition, the volunteer effort represented \$20,000 worth of manhours.

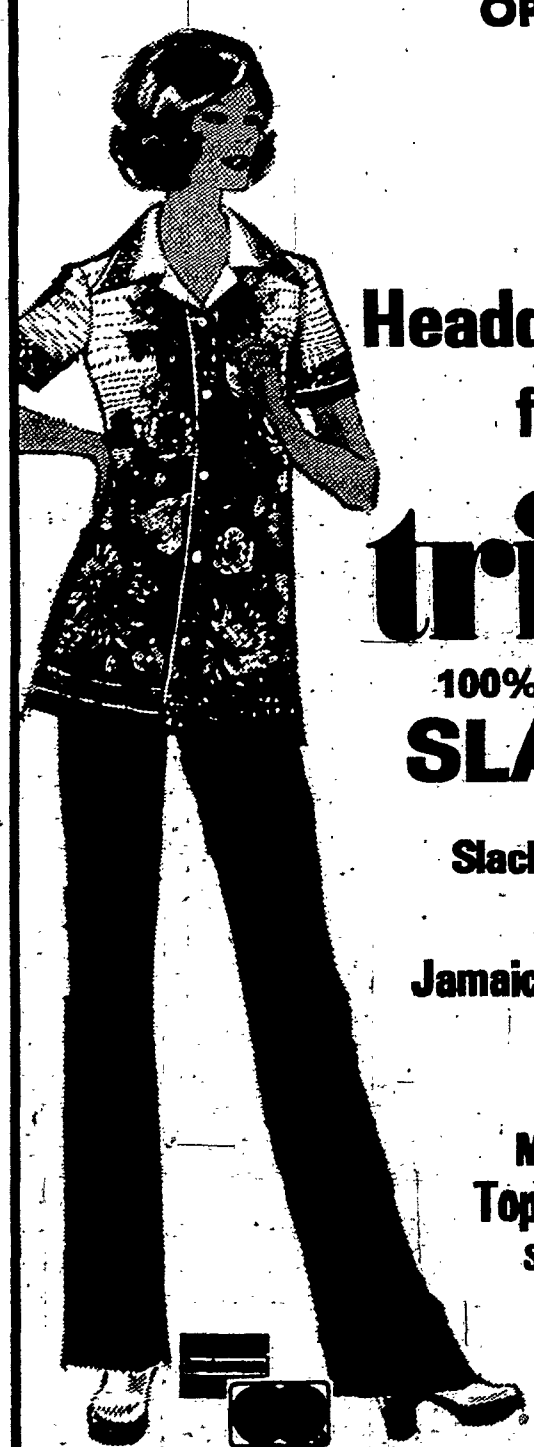
