in God is offered as a replacement for an addict's dependence on drugs. The center is prepared to counsel young people facing other personal problems, but works mainly with drug addicts. A cure rate of 70% is claimed.

D. L. Baize, a graduate of South Eastern Bible college, is director of the local center. He outlined the following program:

After three to four months at an induction center, a member goes on to the Teen Challenge training center in Rehrersburg, Pa. for six to nine months of spiritual education and vocational training.

Completion of this part of the program will either signal an end to an individual's involvement or lead him further into the program. He may become an intern staff member or live temporarily in a Teen Challenge house while working at an outside job and paying room and board.
