

Courier Readers More Than Fill Bill

So, All Right Already, Stop Sending Those Cards

People are always complaining about "junk mail" — the win-a-million contests, the magazine offers, the insurance pitches, and the like.

But Mrs. Frank Smith of Quincy Street gets a different sort of discardable material in her mailbox. She gets used Christmas cards.

It all started in January, when she wrote the Courier-Journal, asking people to send her old cards from which she made gifts for hospital patients. She needed about 1,200 cards.

The day the edition which carried her letter appeared (Jan. 10), her mail was late. So, before she knew that her letter was printed, there was a knock on her door, and a man appeared with stacks of used cards.

The cards have been coming in constantly since then, and Mrs. Smith has had her fill. "I've thrown away seven ashcans full of them," she says. "I've already got enough cards saved up for next Christmas, and the one after that, and the one after that."

She has in vain written the Courier, twice more, politely asking the card senders to stop. The deluge continues.

"I've received at least 50,000 cards," she says. "They've come from all over the diocese."

Her latest reported package arrived on June 30, but she doesn't think it will be her last. "I went to California in February to visit my son," she says, "and I asked the paperboy to pick up my mail for me. When I got back, his father had the back of his station wagon full of packages for me."

Mrs. Smith has also received about 50 telephone calls from prospective card senders. "People get mad when I tell them I can't use their cards," she says, "but if they send them to me, I'm just going to heave them." She does have some good words for the senders, however. "It's wonderful to think that people are this concerned," she says. "I've gotten some lovely letters from people thanking me for taking their cards."
