

Heritage Day Planned July 22

A free, public concert is planned as the highlight of Heritage Day Sunday, July 22.

Heritage Day is a community open house planned to acquaint area residents with The Heritage, an apartment residence and companion facility to St. Ann's at 1500 Portland Ave.

Featured performers will be the Brighton Chamber Players, a string and woodwind quintet which will present a program of Haydn and Mozart classics during the event which takes place between 3 p.m. and 5 p.m. that Sunday.

The afternoon also will include a crafts display and information center of area organizations representing the elderly, since The Heritage is a residence designed especially to meet the needs of this population.

Sister Marie Michelle, administrator for St. Ann's and The Heritage, said, "We hope this open house is the first of many happy social gatherings held here."

The lawn concert will be informally staged, and persons planning to attend can bring chairs and blankets for personal seating. In case of rain, the performance will move indoors.

The Heritage opened to residents on June 1. It offers personal apartment living for the elderly within reach of supportive services — dining, health and recreation. It is open to all men and women in the Monroe County area, regardless of religious faith, race or national origin.



THE HOLY FATHER'S MISSION AID TO THE ORIENTAL CHURCH

When people ask why priests in India are working to find water I go to the faucet and return with an empty glass.

Water, like breathing, is something we take for granted. Without it we cannot eat, or drink, or wash, or be baptized.

People, too, we sometimes take for granted. In India there are 530 million—more than twice as many people as in the U.S.A. and Canada combined. The average Indian's take-home pay is less than 50¢ a week.
