Mrs. A.M.B. has written suggesting that the idea I presented in a recent column of having a day care center for the use of mothers who DO NOT work outside the home be given consideration.

She wrote: "It would indeed be a kind deed to have some place where mothers who work all day at home, sometimes under continual stress and strain, could at times find a little peace and a change of pace."

In the original column on the subject I pointed out that in today's mobile world, very seldom do young, overworked mothers with two or three preschoolers have anyone who can serve as a surrogate mother for an hour or so each day.

The reader who liked the idea did not give her age but the handwriting leads me to think (perhaps erroneously) she is not a young woman.

And if that is the case, it is women such as herself that I had in mind as possible choices to staff such centers.

The idea is not original with me. In various places around the country, older men and women, long retired from their paternal and maternal chores have found work mothering and fathering youngsters who either have no homes or whose parents are unable to take care of them. In most cases, however, these children are under jurisdiction of various government agencies. The amount paid these older persons is relatively small but the benefits both to the children they care for and to themselves are inestimable.

Elmira Nun Named To County Office

Elmira — Sister M. Juliana O'Hara, SSJ, has been appointed director of the Chemung County Office for the Aging. The program was officially established July 1 by the New York State Office for the Aging.

Sister Juliana has been involved in the aging projects of Chemung County since her graduation from the Sloan Institute of Hospital Administration at Cornell University.

She was named the first coordinator of the Elmira Lions Club's program for aging in 1971, which was the forerunner of the present plan.

The new appointment will involve continuing the existing services for senior citizens and developing new ones.

Sister Juliana has been a staff nurse at St. Ann's Home in Rochester, science instructor, and assistant and associate director at St. Joseph's Hospital School of Nursing, Elmira. She was also a New York regional consultant to the White House Conference on the Aging.

She was on the business faculty of Nazareth Academy 1949-55 and in the secretarial office of that high school until 1969, when she retired from full-time duty.

Sister received her bachelor degree in secretarial science from Nazareth College and her Masters in business education from New York University.
