One of the major events in the Second Vatican Council was the approval and publication of the Sacred Constitution on the Liturgy. That document reads " . . . Liturgical services pertain to the whole body of the Church; they manifest it and have effects upon it; but they concern individual members of the Church in different ways, according to the diversity of holy orders, functions, and degrees of participation." (Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, III. 26)
