ABC's 'Dignity of Death' to Explore St. Christopher's Hospice, London

New York [RNS] — "The Dignity of Death," an ABC-TV network special slated for Sept. 9, will take an in-depth look at treatment of the terminally-ill at a private institution in London pioneering in relieving the medical and spiritual suffering of dying.

Premiering the ABC-TV News' religious-cultural series, "Directions," the half-hour special (1 p.m. EDT) will visit St. Christopher's Hospice, where the average stay of a patient is one month — before death. However, 10 per cent of the 70-bed facility is reserved for "long-term" sufferers from mental and nervous disorders.

WOKR-TV, Channel 13, which is the Rochester ABC outlet, will not air the program, because it

does not regularly carry the "Directions" series.

The listings of other stations within the reception range of the diocese may be consulted to determine whether the show will be broadcast by them.

ABC News London bureau chief George Watson will interview the founder-director, Dr. Cicely Saunders; the hospice chaplain, the Rev. Philip Edwards; staff members and patients.

St. Christopher's, radically different from most hospitals, permits visitors — including children and pets — whenever they please. Terminal patients are urged to make the most of their remaining days, even to the extent of taking vacations where medically possible.

African Drought Refugees Helped by Catholic Group

Shipments of medicines and medical supplies to Senegal and Upper Volta, two of the six sub-Saharan countries affected by drought, are now being readied by the Catholic Medical Mission Board, 10 West 17th St., New York City.

The shipments will not only help Senegal and Upper Volta drought victims, but they will also help thousands of refugees fleeing Mauritania and Mali because of the drought.

Also being prepared by CMMB are shipments to Nigeria and Cameroon for refugees from drought-devastated Niger and Chad.

Last month CMMB shipped 41,035 pounds of medicines and medical supplies, valued at \$107,000 to 60 Ivory Coast mission centers, for refugees from Upper Volta and Mali. Included

were vitamins, streptomycin and other antibiotics, analgesics, soap, skin ointments, bandages, dressings, adhesive tape and medications to treat parasitic infections, tuberculosis, malaria and leprosy.

Authorities believe that the next 60 days will be critical for sub-Saharan natives remaining in remote desert areas of the six afflicted countries as well as those who have fled to the countries to the south. If the relief distribution program is not

expedited, they warn, millions may die from starvation and its attendant diseases.

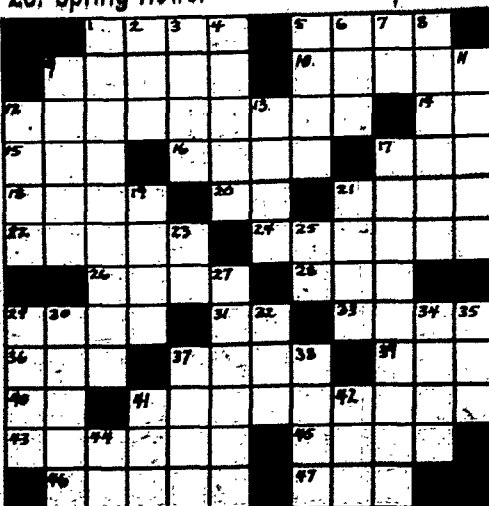

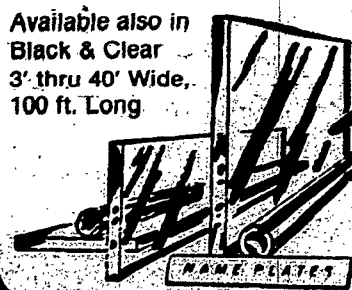
