

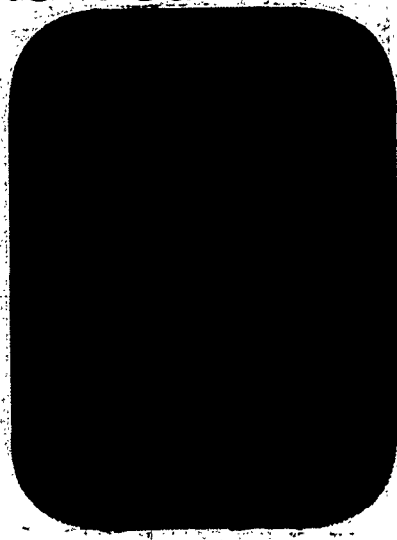
OLPH Parishioner Named 'Teacher of the Year'

Elizabeth Meagher, a public school teacher for many years and a member of the parish education commission at Our Lady of Perpetual Help, has been chosen "Teacher of the Year" by her colleagues in the East Irondequoit Teachers Association.

A "superior ability to inspire love of learning" is listed as the most important qualification in the guidelines that led to her selection.

Miss Meagher has been a teacher and chairman of the English department at Ridgewood Middle School for the past 14 years, and has taught English in Summer school at Eastridge High. Beginning as a teacher of all subjects in all grades in a rural school near Webster, she developed her specialty during 14 years at Laurelton School.

The "Teacher of the Year" received a plaque Sept. 4 at Eastridge at a general meeting of teachers and administrators of the district.

A few years ago I nearly dropped the Sacred Host while distributing Holy Communion. The reason? A nine-year-old girl followed by her mother. I have never seen such an identical likeness excepting in twins. They startled me. The child's dark, curly hair, her azure blue eyes, the shape of the nose and ears, the coloring and texture of the skin made the child a perfect miniature of the mother.

As we ponder the life of Christ we remember He was the Son of God and the Son of our Blessed Mother. Our Lord's only human parent was Mary. His human nature was derived totally from His Mother.

A standard devotion in the Church is to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Even in the shifting emphasis in many devotions, the devotion to the Sacred Heart remains firm, profitable and theologically respectable. The devotion is to the love of God for us, symbolized in the Heart of Christ. "Behold this Heart which has loved men so much, especially in the Sacrament of My love" is what He said to St. Margaret Mary at Paray le Moniel, France, 1675. The Scriptures are full of Our Lord's love for us. He practiced the ultimate: "Greater love than this no man has than to lay down his life for his friend."

In the litany of the Sacred Heart we have the rhythm of poetry, the accuracy of doctrine and the beat of the Heart of Jesus pulsating God's love for us. "Heart of Jesus, Son of the Eternal Father; Heart of Jesus, formed by the Holy Spirit in the womb of the Virgin Mother; Heart of Jesus, Tabernacle of the Most High; Heart of Jesus, enriching all who invoke you."

However, to understand Jesus

best, we need to understand His Mother. She is that unique Woman, chosen from eternity, for a special work, which is accomplished by the Holy Spirit. Gabriel announced Jesus as the Son of the Father. The neighbors at Nazareth knew Him as the Son of Mary, and thought Him also the Son of Joseph. Through the Church, with the angels, we know of Him as He is: the Son of God and the Son of the Blessed Virgin. No wonder she sang the Magnificat: "He who is mighty has done great things unto me, and Holy is His Name. Henceforth, all generations shall call me blessed!"

October is the month of the rosary, and it comes soon. No devotion in the Western Church, outside of Mass, has kept Catholics more conscious of the life of Jesus and Mary than the rosary. About two years ago a Methodist pastor in England became so intrigued by this devotion that he introduced it to his congregation. Then he wrote a book on the rosary entitled: "Ten for Joy; Five for Sorrow."

Recently I talked with Al Walz at Trant's Religious Store while ordering 200 more copies of the Rosary Novena booklet. He said that even with the pathetic uncertainty among some Catholics, purchases in the store indicate that the rosary and the Rosary Novena have retained their popularity with The People; and that the devotion has increased these past two years. Margaret McCarthy, a friend of mine who runs the Madonna Shop in El Paso, Texas, wrote: "Down here there has never been any drop in the rosary devotion. Rather, there has been an increase."

The Rosary Novena is recommended for three reasons: 1) it assists devotion because of the meditations given for each mystery; 2) it gives an element of effective discipline, so that the name of the devotion is not: "I ought to get around to saying the rosary one of these days," but rather: "Where is my rosary booklet? Today is my 33rd day;" 3) it is an efficacious devotion through which Our Lady grants requests to those with faith and love.
