Two young Episcopal priests have recently published books which can be of great help in religious education classes in designing creative liturgies.

Rev. David Edman of Grace Church, Scottsville, wrote "Of Wise Men and Fools," which is subtitled "Realism in the Bible." Rev. Thomas B. Woodward, chaplain at the University of Rochester, has authored "To Celebrate." Both books are available at book stores, particularly from the book store of the Episcopal Diocese, 935 East Ave., Rochester, just next door to Bishop Kearney's home.

Father Woodward's book is a record of his own imaginative services at the U of R Interfaith Chapel over the past several years. His plan is unique because, he says, "It involves the whole parish: families in the home, children in the church school, the congregation in the family service."

Our Roman Catholic "Come to the Father" series had tried to bind home and school in a cooperative educational adventure but Sunday Mass has invariably followed a separate direction. Father Woodward's proposal coordinates home, school and church. Each of his units, which vary from one to several weeks, includes suggestions for family activities, church school activities, ritual and sermon possibilities.

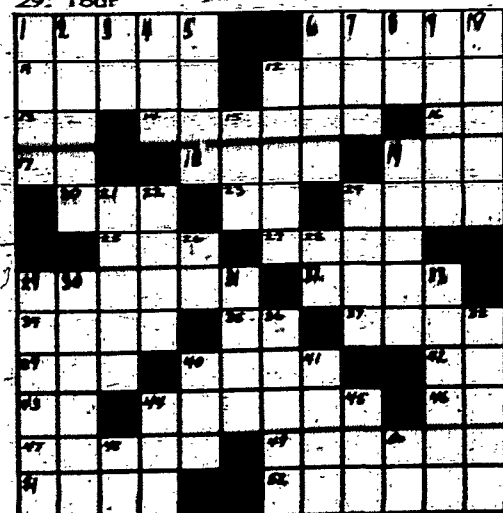
