There was a healthy amount of philosophizing in the first show, a kind of refreshing offbeat humor and a lovely, lovely job turned in by Coco.

If you missed the first show look for the rerun because there's a confessional scene that highlights the talents of Coco, Bologna and Taylor. Could be a winning trio.
