Pope Meets Dalai Lama

Vatican City [RNS] — The Dalai Lama, exiled spiritual leader of Tibet's Buddhists, was received in private audience by Pope Paul VI on Sept. 30, according to a Vatican Radio announcement.

The 38-year-old Buddhist leader, who has been living in India since the Chinese took over his Himalayan country in 1959, began a visit to 13 Western European countries, his first such visit, on Sept. 27.

Holy Rosary School and Aquinas Institute. After his graduation from Canisius College in 1929, he taught for five years at Aquinas and then studied for the priesthood at St. Bernard's and at the University of Fribourg, Switzerland. He was ordained at Fribourg in 1938, and awarded a Ph.D. degree there in 1940. While at Nazareth, 1940-1954, he served the Chapel of the Immaculate Heart of Mary at Bushnell's Basin and also, from 1949 until 1953, was administrator of St. Gregory's Church in Marion.

Father Philipps, born in Rochester Jan. 21, 1929, was brought up in Immaculate Conception parish, educated for the priesthood in St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's seminaries and ordained in 1955. He has served at St. Michael's and Blessed Sacrament, Rochester, and has been at the Pittsford parish for the past seven years.

Pope Paul Notes 76

Vatican City [RNS] — Sept. 26 marked the 76th birthday of Pope Paul VI.

In a comment on the occasion, Vatican Radio remarked that "this happy event" had called forth "a multitude of good wishes not only from the faithful, but from persons the world over who appreciate the Holy Father's untiring work for the spiritual development of mankind and for peace among peoples."

In what was seen as a ploy to forestall the almost inevitable speculation about papal health and retirement that has cropped up in recent years whenever the Pope's birthday rolled around, the broadcast added:

"Paul VI is celebrating his birthday in the fullness of his apostolic ministry, and, thanks to God's grace, in the vigor of his physical and spiritual energies, which he expends liberally as the good shepherd guiding the flock entrusted to him by Christ."

Council of Arbitration

The diocesan "due process" machinery includes an arbitration board for the resolution of grievances that resist conciliation. Among the members of this group are four lawyers, each of whom has held public office or has been involved professionally in arbitration proceedings. They are backed up by three other practising attorneys, who were chosen as alternates by Pastoral Council Formation Committee electors.

In addition, five diocesan priests and two Sisters will serve.

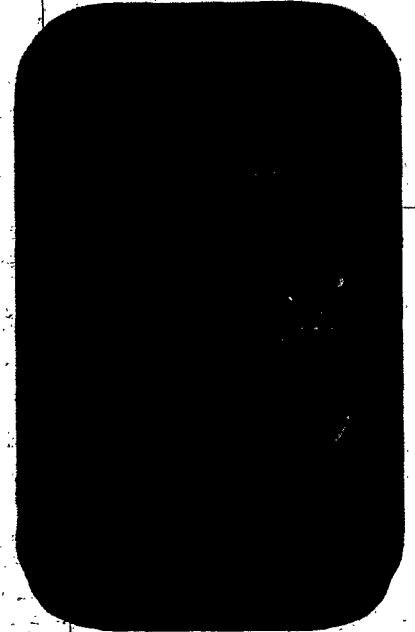
