In Diocese

Two Ontario County community projects which focus on the diverse area of home improvements and Spanish culture were granted more than \$76,000 in self-help grants by the U.S. Catholic Bishops Campaign for Human Development. The Geneva Homes Improvement and the Spanish Association of the Finger Lakes received \$51,750 and \$25,000 respectively.

Money obtained by the Spanish Association will be used to establish a cultural center to serve the counties of Yates; Seneca, Wayne and Ontario. The center will house adult education and job opportunity resources and will attempt to meet the needs of the area's migrant workers. Liaison activities between local, state and federal agencies will be conducted by the association's staff which is based in Geneva.

The Geneva Homes Improvement provides for the rehabilitation of homes and will allot part of its grant for the continuation of a rotating pool of funds to be used for interest free loans. A minority lawyer will be hired to handle technical, financial, administrative and political details.
