

# Pat Boone to 'Reach Out' At War Memorial Show

Mention the name Pat Boone and many people will probably think of movies like "April Love" or songs like "Love Letters in the Sand." But the famous entertainer, focusing on the popular charismatic movement, will appear Oct. 19 at 8 p.m. in the Rochester War Memorial as part of the Reach Out with Love program.

The Pat Boone Family Show is the second event in the Reach Out program developed by the Christian Center in Brockport. The appearance of Baroness Maria Von Trapp, launched the program in June.

Slated as a "show that will provide the entire family with a memorable experience," the performance will include the appearance of The McCrary, a family singing group of two sisters and three brothers whose tunes range from ballad to semi-classical. Their career, like Boone's, was launched on the Ted Mack Amateur Hour.

Greg Shideler, a comedian who incorporates sound effects into his comedy routine, is another member of the 15 man team. He has appeared on the Tonight Show and the Mike Douglas Show.

The highlight of the revival,



however, will be the appearance of the youthful rock and roll star who states that he is a direct descendent of the frontiersman Daniel Boone. Pat Boone's first

hit "Two Hearts, Two Kisses" began a singing career that includes the sale of over 45 million records, 13 Gold Records and 7 Gold Albums.

# Kids' Homework: Eating Soup

"Hmmm good" that's what elementary school children are singing these days as they gobble down bowlfuls of that popular soup. Their efforts, however, are not geared toward nutrition but toward a contest in which labels can be redeemed for school audio visual equipment.

"Campbell soup labels are a new kind of trading stamp" is one slogan used to promote the "Labels for Education" contest that has been undertaken by some of the diocesan elementary schools. "It's a simple idea, it doesn't cost anything and Campbell's soup is good for the kids," said Sister Mary Beatrice Neukirchen, principal of Holy Ghost School.

Participating schools can begin

to sending in labels on Oct. 15. By this date schools must have completed an agreement and reservation form to give suppliers an indication of what items are being sought. Contest ends Dec. 15.

A high-spirited effort is being made at Holy Trinity School in Webster. Sister Mary Lou Kime, a fifth grade teacher and coordinator of the project, described it "as a real extra for us. There's always pressure for money so this helps us. The labels are just something you throw away."

Sister Mary Lou hopes to "get the whole parish in on the activity." Cardboard boxes painted like giant Campbell soup cans have been placed in the vestibule of the church so parishioners can donate labels. "Some of the girls have become cheerleaders to get

kids to bring in the labels," she said.

Various pieces of audio visual equipment can be obtained with the labels that are valued at 1/20 of one cent. A carousel projector requires 6,350 labels; a movie projector, 44,000 and a tape recorder, 4400. Sister Mary Lou priced the actual cost of the carousel projector at approximately \$63.
