## PDK to Vote On Admitting Women Teachers

Phi Delta Kappa, an international fraternity of professional educators, will reopen the constitutional question of admitting women to membership, during its upcoming convention in Houston, Texas.

Father Albert Gelens, CSB, principal of Aquinas Institute, will register a "yes" vote as delegate of the Rochester Field Chapter. Members voted on the issue last Spring, he said.

The 34th biennial council will meet Oct. 18-21 at the Shamrock Hilton. Dr. Arthur Schneider, principal of Shroeder Senior High School in Webster, will attend as alternate delegate of the Rochester Field Chapter, which has approximately 250 members.

Phi Delta Kappa claims 90,000 members in six countries, and describes itself as the largest professional fraternity in the world. There are very few priests or Religious among them, according to Father Gelens. Membership is by invitation.

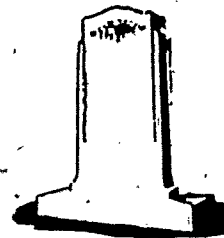
The 1971 council declined by a vote of 321 to 94 to admit women, according to a PDK report. Since then, the Harvard and Cornell chapters have added women to their membership and, in accordance with the constitution, have been suspended, the announcement said. The board of directors has recommended local option.

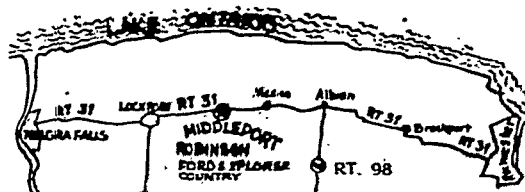
