Main speakers for the event were New York Senator James Buckley, Dr. Mildred Jefferson, a professor of surgery at Boston University, and Rev. Charles Carrol, an Episcopalian minister doing studies of the Nuremberg trials.

Amnesty Week Is Declared

A press conference Monday opened National Amnesty Week being sponsored here by the Rochester Area Clergy and Laity Concerned (CALC).

The press conference took place in front of the Federal Building. The CALC declared in a statement that the "time has come to start thinking about how to heal the wounds of war and to reconcile the deep divisiveness brought on during the last, bloody decade."

"The reunification of prisoners of war with their families brings home the reality of the many families that have yet to be reunited because their sons refused to serve in the armed forces during the Vietnam War."

Rev. Bredesen: He Changed Boone's Life

One of the main links in the long chain of events that has led to the appearance of entertainer Pat Boone in Rochester is Rev. Harald Bredesen, internationally known as one of the primary leaders of the charismatic movement.

Boone is now its national chairman with Bredesen serving on the advisory board. In his latest book, A New Song, the youthful rock and roll singer credits Bredesen with Boone's "new relationship with God."

Boone will perform at the Rochester War Memorial Oct. 19 at 8 p.m., as part of the Reach Out with Love program sponsored by the Christian Center of Brockport. Rev. Don Rilling director of the center, met Rev. Bredesen on a recent trip to Israel and arranged for the Dutch reform minister to speak in Rochester last Spring.

Bredesen, who lives in Victoria, B.C., Canada, is cited in the Encyclopedia Britannica along with the description of the charismatic renewal.

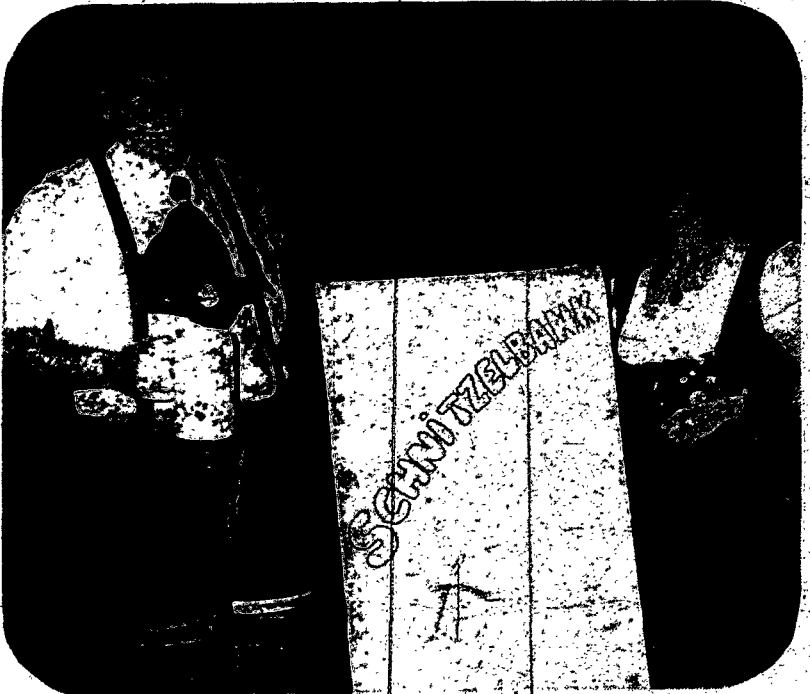
Rev. Bredesen became the link up between the Christian Center and Boone which resulted in a Reach Out with Love ministry.

Appearing with Boone will be The McGrady, a family singing group, and comedian Greg Shideler.

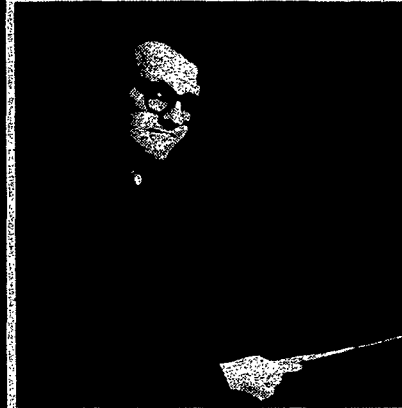
