Being Chris

On Oct. 21, Catholics around the world will celebrate a common mission: as the People of God, they must be Christ to others, and as "catholic" Christians, they must be Christ to all people the world over. This is the message of Mission Sunday.

Nobody says that the people of the Third World countries do not need help. Poverty and its consequences strike at the heart of human dignity — socially, physically, spiritually. And this world of poverty is home today for an estimated two billion human beings — more than half of the entire race. Some of the symptoms of poverty: underdevelopment, disease, illiteracy, social injustice, affluent indifference, and inhuman living conditions.

In this unattractive picture of the world of the poor, however, there is hope. — the "redeeming" force of missionaries at work. Through the priests, brothers, and nuns who are dedicating themselves, their lives, to the otherwise largely forgotten masses, Christ's truth is being heard.
