Cardinals Press For Revision in Spain Concordat

Vatican City [RNS] — Two high ranking Spanish Catholic prelates have arrived here to discuss with Vatican officials a revision of the 20-year-old concordat between Spain and the Holy See.

They are Cardinal Vincente Enrique y Tarancon of Madrid, president of the Spanish Bishops' Conference, and Cardinal Jose M. Bueno y Monreal of Seville, conference vice-president.

According to Vatican sources, the Holy See wants the Spanish government to give up its privilege of nominating new bishops for Spanish dioceses.

In exchange, the sources said, the Holy See is willing to forego its "courthouse privilege," under which permission from the local bishop is required before Spanish courts can try Roman Catholic priests charged with offenses.

Attempts to revise the 1953 concordat over the past four years have ended in deadlock.

Specifically, the present church-state agreement grants Generalissimo Francisco Franco the right to nominate residential bishops (from a list of three candidates selected by the Pope from a previous list of six names, drawn up jointly by the papal Nuncio and the Spanish Minister for Foreign Affairs).

The agreement declares Roman Catholicism the official religion of Spain, and grants special privileges to Catholic clergy, including exemption from military service and immunity from arrest except with the consent of their bishops.

Other provisions in the agreement provide for state paid priests' salaries, compulsory religious instruction in all schools and universities, recognition of religious marriages as the only legal form, and prohibition of divorce.
